

License Renewals Slow

RALEIGH — Is your car registration due to expire November 30? Acting Motor Vehicles Commissioner J. M. Penny noted that both mail-in and over-the-counter sales for November license plate renewals have been slow.

"We are encouraging our citizens who need to renew their license plates in November to go to the nearest license plate sales office as soon as possible to get their tags and stickers," he said.

Tags and stickers for the November 1982 renewals have been on sale since mid-October, when renewal notices were mailed to those owners whose stickers expire November, 1981.

Driving a vehicle without a current valid registration is a misdemeanor in North Carolina, punishable by a fine up to \$100 or imprisonment up to 60 days, or both.

A brochure that is included with the license plate renewal card shows the correct placement of the validation sticker on the license plate.

A license plate that has a "1981 year" sticker on it should either be cleaned off so that the new sticker can be placed directly on top of it, or peeled off and replaced by the new sticker. The sticker on the left side showing the month is permanent.

Penny said the renewal fee for cars is \$16, and the renewal fee for a 4,000 pound pick-up truck is \$21.50. He added that motorists who are renewing registration on their vehicles should make sure that their correct address is shown on the front of the renewal card and that they fill out the insurance information and sign the back of the card.

Prices Making Milk A Bargain

Although there have been nominal price increases to dairy farmers for fluid milk during the past year, milk is a better bargain today than ever before, the president of the N. C. Farm Bureau stated recently.

According to John Sledge, a recent price survey indicates that in four out of five major markets in the state, the predominant supermarket price for a gallon of milk is now less than a year ago.

The four areas are Asheville, Charlotte,

Greensboro and Winston-Salem. Sledge said the prevailing gallon milk price of \$1.89 in the Charlotte area is now 14 cents less than a year ago. He said current prices in Asheville and Winston-Salem are 6 cents lower, while the Greensboro price is 12 cents lower than a year ago.

While acknowledging that the prevailing gallon price in Raleigh is around 10 per cent higher, he said

some half-gallons are being priced at 20 per cent under last year's prices.

Current milk prices in many parts of North Carolina compare very favorably with the rest of the U. S. and are lower than in many large metropolitan areas, Sledge stated. "This makes milk an especially good buy at this time," he said.

The Farm Bureau president said statistics for

September reflect a 6.7 per cent decrease in fluid milk consumption in the state, indicating that a major factor in the decline is the fact that consumption is down around 20 per cent in the public schools.

He said today's bargain prices should encourage consumers to buy more milk, especially parents whose children may now be consuming less milk in their school lunches.

City Officials To Meet

CHARLOTTE — City officials from across North Carolina will gather here November 8-10 for the 72nd Annual Convention of the N. C. League of Municipalities, looking for ways to balance tight budgets against shrinking revenues.

The convention is expected to draw about 1,600 municipal officials — from mayors and governing board members to department heads — to the Civic Center for the two and one-half days of workshops and speeches by state and national figures.

Governor James B. Hunt, Jr., will speak to the delegates at the closing luncheon on November 10. The municipal officials also will be addressed by: Presidential Advisor for Intergovernmental Affairs, Steven Rhodes; New Orleans Mayor Ernest N. Morial, and spokesmen for several state agencies. Mayor Morial will speak to them Monday at a luncheon

and Rhodes will bring them insight into President Reagan's plan for balancing the federal system in a speech Tuesday morning. Workshops will be held Monday morning and Tuesday morning, the League will elect officers for 1981-82 Monday afternoon, and all will be treated to remarks by noted Washington, D. C. humorist, Mark Russell, on Monday night.
