Company Name Selected

Norfolk Southern Corporation is the new name selected for the holding company that will be formed with the affiliation of Southern Railway and Norfolk and Western Railway.

The new name was selected "to reflect the rich heritage evoked by the existing names of the two railroads," said Robert B. Claytor, president and chief executive officer of Norfolk and Western and Harold H. Hall, president and chief executive officer of Southern.

Since the combination of the two railroads was proposed last year, the holding company has been tentatively identified as NWS Enterprises, Inc.

"We recognize that the names of Southern and Norfolk and Western are well established, and that people have very positive feelings about those names. 'Norfolk Southern Corporation' preserves that favorable identification much better than a collection of initials," the two railroad executives said.

The two railroads incorporated NWS Enterprises, Inc. as a Virginia corporation in July, 1980, and elected an interim board to manage the affairs of the company until the affiliation of the railroads takes place. That interim board has approved the change in name to Norfolk Southern Corporation, as have the two railroads, who are the only stockholders of the new company right now.

The name change has been filed with the State Corporation Commission of Virginia, which has issued a

certificate of amendment to the holding company's charter reflecting the new name.

Claytor and Hall said the proposed combination "is proceeding rapidly and smoothly" through the Interstate Commerce Commission, whose approval of the transaction is required. After completing its hearings on the combination, the ICC officially closed the record on the proceeding on October 30. Under the law, the ICC must reach a decision on the proposal within 180 days of the date, or no later than April 28.

"We hope they will be able to reach a decision sooner than that, given the withdrawal of all major opposition," Hall and Claytor said. "We think we have presented a compelling case for granting approval."

Handicapped Can Get Reduced Rates

TARBORO — Carolina Telephone's hearing or speech-impaired customers, who utilize telecommunications devices to place long distance calls from a residence phone, are eligible to receive reduced rates for out-of-state calls effective October 30.

The reduction is 35 per cent for calls placed during the day-rate period (8 A. M. to 5 P. M.) and 60 per cent for calls placed during the evening-rate period (5 P. M. to 11 P. M.). No reductions beyond those already in effect would be made for calls placed during the night-rate period, and there would be no reductions at any time for operator-handled calls.

Carolina Telephone currently offers rate discounts for in-state long distance calls made by persons who are deaf or speech-impaired and communicate by a telecommunications device.

To qualify for the special rate, a written certification of speech and hearing impairment must be presented to a Carolina Telephone business office or Phone Shop. Certification forms can be obtained from a business office or Phone Shop. Those customers now

receiving reduced rates need no additional certification.

Carolina Telephone also is offering at its cost on a direct sales basis a portable telephone device (teletypewriter) which can be used by the deaf and speech-impaired from their homes. A related item sold at Carolina Telephone's cost is a ring signaler that flashes a light near the teletypewriter to let a deaf person know the phone is ringing. These items can be purchased through a

Interest Rates Increase

GREENSBORO — The annual interest rate charged on tax underpayments and paid on overpayments will rise from 12 to 20 per cent on February 1, 1982, the Internal Revenue Service says.

The rate on the underpayment of individual and corporate estimated taxes and most other tax law provisions imposing interest also will be 20 per cent.

The rate change is provided for in the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981, the IRS said. The new law provides that the rate is set each October

15 and is based on 100 per cent of the average prime interest rate for the preceding month.
