a course in millwork and cabinetmaking for the first time during the up-coming winter quarter.

Offered on a Monday, Wednesday, Friday schedule the course involves a total of 220 hours of instruction and shop experience for which ten credit hours are awarded by the college. Meeting Mondays and Wednesdays from 8:30 A. M. until 4:30 P. M. and Friday from 8:30 A. M. until 1:30 P. M. The course will last for eleven weeks from January 6 until March 23.

Hands - on experience in the shop is augmented by classroom work as students study and perform cabinetmaking and interior trim and finish work as practiced by the General Contracor in Residential and Light Commercial Construction and Remodeling. Emphasis is placed on developing a working knowledge of wood, wood products, hand and power tools, jointery, design and layout, and construction of cabinets and their subassemblies. This is not a hobby-type course. It is designed for the serious student desiring a firm, basic education in cabinetmaking. There are no prerequsits.

Registration for the course is January 5, 1982, at the college. Cost is 32.50 plus text (Which is ap-proximately \$20.). For information about this or other courses call 946-6194.
