During the seven-month cruise, TACELRON-133 was embarked aboard the aircraft carrier USS American and participated in several



The N. C. Climate Program provides all available climate records for the state, including original data and general summaries of temperature and precipitation for many places in the state, records of other weather elements at selected sites.

Continued From Page 1-B studies and evaluations, the RCA process drew on studies made by the Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census, Fish and Wildlife Service, Environmental Protection Agency, Water Resources Council, Bureau of Outdoor Recreation and others.

RCA Appraisal Part 1, the first of three major documents, contains detailed information on the resource base -- status, conditions and trends. A

reference copy of all three available for use at SCS and Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service offices throughout the state.

Copies of a short leaflet summarizing the RCA findings and proposed conservation program are also available at the two USDA offices. It contains a pre-addressed, postage paid response form that people may use to comment on the program.


