Ambrose Ends Med. Tech Class

Coast Guard Boatswain's Mate 3rd Class Harold A. Ambrose, son of Mr. and Mrs. William E. Ambrose of Roper, recently completed an Emergency Medical Technician Course.

The three-week course conducted at the Coast Guard Training Center, Petaluma, Calif., is designed to train non-medical personnel from search and rescue stations and Coast Guard cutters in emergency medical procedures.

The students received instruction in medical terminology, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, treating burns and serious injuries and applying splints, as well as general first aid.

Riddle Makes Top Grade

RALEIGH — Wayne Riddle, traffic manager, N. C. Motor Carriers Association, Raleigh, made the highest grade in the Non-Lawyer Practitioners Examination given by the Interstate Commerce Commission. The 48 passing applicants constituted 31.3 per cent of the total of 153 who took the exam.

Forty-eight non-lawyer applicants seeking admission to practice before the Interstate Commerce Commission passed a written examination given at its field offices throughout the nation.

Successful applicants are now permitted to practice before the ICC as their certification is now complete, as soon as they take their oath.

In announcing the successful applicants, who represented 31.3 per cent of the total of 153 who sat for the examination, the Commission noted that the 1981 examination was "quite different" from past examinations in that one section of the test (the second of two sections) was an objective examination requiring short answers—multiple choice, fill-in the

blank, and true-false—rather than the traditional essay answers.

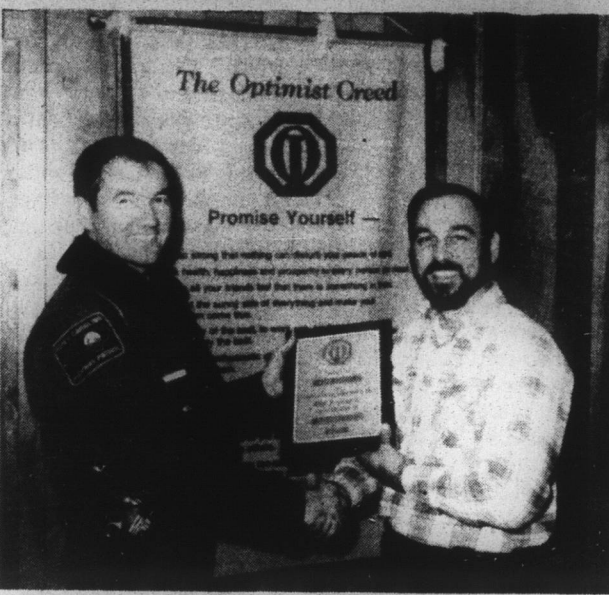
Copies of the examination and answers may be obtained by writing to the ICC, Office of the Secretary, Practitioners Register, Room 2104, Washington, D.C. 20423.

The first section of the examination—the essay type—consisted of 11 questions. The second section, divided into three parts, consisted of 100 consecutively numbered questions. For each question, the ICC provided the correct or suggested answer.

Only one other Tarheel passed the examination—Ronnie L. Painter, traffic dept., General Electric Co., Fletcher, N.C.

Coast Guard Legislation OK'd

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Rep. Walter B. Jones, chairman of the Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee, has commended Congress for passing legislation to prevent reductions in force for civilian personnel of the U. S. Coast Guard.

In giving final approval to S. 831, the Coast Guard Authorization Bill for Fiscal Year 1982, the House added a provision stating that the civilian personnel level for the Coast Guard must be at least 5,484. This number represents the personnel strength of the Coast Guard at the close of the last fiscal year, September 30, 1981.

Rep. Jones stated, "Under pressure from the Office of Management and Budget, the Coast Guard was preparing contingency plans to pay off up to 431 civilians nationwide. Congress' clear intent in S. 831 is to prevent these job

cuts. Assuming that the President signs S. 831 into law, there should be no threat of reductions in Coast Guard civilian employment.

"The Coast Guard has received strong bipartisan support in both Houses of Congress", Jones continued. "Present funding and personnel for this service is already insufficient to carry out the mandates given to the Coast Guard, which include search and rescue, drug interdiction, enforcement of fisheries laws and interception of Haitian refugees. This is certainly no time to cut the Coast Guard's resources or personnel and that is why Congress has legislated a personnel floor."

The House Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee, chaired by Rep. Jones, has legislative responsibility for the Coast Guard's budgets and activities.
