

Friends Have Reunion After 40 Year Wait

Two friends had a special reunion a few weeks ago. They saw each other for the first time in 40 years.

Ai-Yun Tai and Sandy Mallinson were both born in Xuzhou, China, which is 400 miles from Shanghai, and

played together as children. Mrs. Mallinson's parents were missionaries in China under the Presbyterian Church. The two friends were separated at the beginning of World War II, a separation that was to last a long time.

Sandy Mallinson and her husband, Rev. H. E. Mallinson, visited China last year in November. While there they had dinner with Ai-Yun-Tai's parents and husband. Ai-Yun-Tai's father, a Chinese pastor, had baptized Mrs. Mallinson when she was a baby. They learned that Ai-Yun-Tai was in America doing research on the Zoology of Crustaceans at Harvard University for one year.

Ai-Yun-Tai had dinner with Mrs. Mallinson's parents in Atlanta, Ga. during the Christmas holidays, and came to Edenton after leaving.

A Layer of Tears
