Insurance Bill Wins Approval

In the closing days of the 1981 Legislative Session, the General Assembly of North Carolina, after much scrutiny and consideration, passed House Bill No. 983 sponsored by Representative Charles Evans (D-1st District-Nags Head) to require a continuation and conversion privilege on group health insurance policies issued in this state. That bill became effective on January 1, 1982.

By far, not an insignificant piece of legislation, this bill provides the employee of any firm or company covered by a group health policy, the privilege of retaining that coverage for 90 days after termination of employment, whether voluntary or involuntary, so long as he/she makes timely payments as stipulated to the employer and as long as he/she is not eligible under other group coverage such as that of an employed spouse.

In other words, the temporarily unemployed got a break on their group health coverage. Otherwise, they would probably have had none. After the 90 days continuation period is ended, they must automatically be offered a conversion privilege to an individual policy without further evidence of insurability.

The Northeastern Association of Life Underwriters and its parent organization the North Carolina Association of Life Underwriters encouraged the sponsorship of the legislation and its passage in the interest of protection for North Carolina's temporarily unemployed. They feel strongly that the State of North Carolina will more than reap its reward by providing use of private coverage that might otherwise have had to be paid for by government welfare program.
