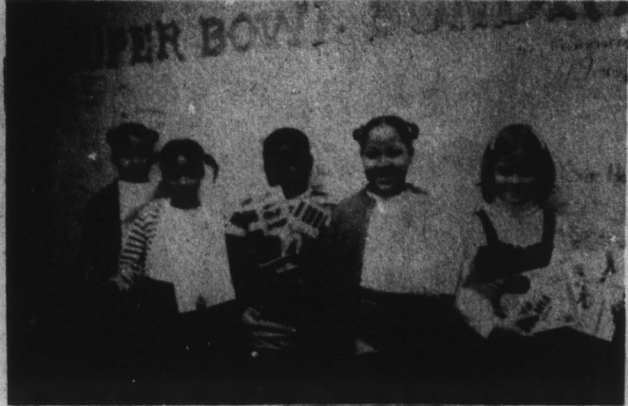


School Holds Super Bowl Activities
