

Artist's Work On Display

The third event in Edenton's Women's Artist Series, sponsored by the Chowan Arts Council and College of The Albemarle, will feature visual artist Karyn Perrella at 8 o'clock Feb. 4 (tonight) at the Old Chowan County Courthouse. Perrella is the 1982 Visiting Artist at Richmond Technical College in Hamlet. Her areas of concentration are drawing and painting.

The painter considers her work to be representational, often using the face as the subject. "I am concerned with the person behind the face, the emotion behind the expression," she explains. "My objective is to create an empathy in the viewer with the people in my drawings and paintings."

Her program Thursday night will provide a unique approach to the medium of art through the use of

examples of her work and a slide presentation, according to Michael Chapdelaine, series coordinator. Chapdelaine is the Visiting Artist at COA.

Perrella's professional experience has been in art education. Chapdelaine said she has introduced many young people to art and the creative process as an instructor and resource person. "The diverse background of her students has given her valuable experience in communicating her art to a wide age range," he said.

A native of Waterbury, Connecticut, she received her undergraduate training in art from Southern Connecticut State College in New Haven. She earned her master's degree from the Rhode Island College in Providence, and did further graduate study in Florence, Italy.

Composite Fillings

The kind of filling the dentist uses depends on the location of the tooth and the area to be filled. The most common filling is the silver or amalgam type. These are usually used on the flat, biting surfaces where strength is needed or where they will not be visible. For fillings where the material must match the color of the tooth, such as the front teeth and often for gumline fillings of back teeth, your dentist will probably use a filled resin or composite filling. It is tooth colored and the most popular material used today for this use.

Over a period of time, the composite may stain more than the natural

tooth, and eventually filling and tooth may not match as well as they did originally. Also, they may wear at a faster rate because the material is not as hard as silver fillings or as the natural tooth enamel (the hardest tissue in the human body) and not recommended for use on biting surfaces of teeth. Composites, however, have the great advantage of being esthetically pleasing. For most people that outweighs their drawbacks.

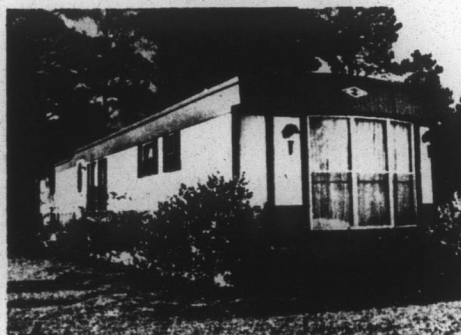
