# WMU Focus Week, Feb. 14-20

Bethel Baptist Church, Hertford, N.C. will be observing WMU Focus Week February 14-20. WMU (Woman's Missionary Union) is an organization for women, girls, and preschoolers. Its purpose and goal is to promote missions through study, financial support, prayer, and personal involvement in missions.

In honor of this observance, there will be a special service on February 17. A churchwide Covered Dish Supper will start at 6 P.M. Following the meal, Dr. and Mrs. Udvarnoki will speak.

Dr. Udvarnoki was born in Hungary and educated in Budapest, Hamburg, Germany, and Southern Baptist Theological

Seminary. He has been professor and past president of the Baptist Theological Seminary, Budapest, Hungary. From 1962-1963 he was Chairman of the Department of Social Science at Chowan College, Murfreesboro, N.C. Due to the Communist take-over of Hungary, Dr. Udvarnoki came to the United States in 1953. He has been pastor at Gatesville Baptist Church and the author of books and articles for such publications as Christianity Today, Watchman Examiner, Canadian Baptist, Biblical Recorder and The Baptist Program. He is a lecturer on European Christianity, International Affairs and Christianity Behind the Iron Curtain.

Since 1967, he has been editor of "Evangelism Hirkok" (Gospel Messenger) an American Hungarian bi-monthly Baptist magazine.

Mrs. Udvarnoki is a native of Granville County, N.C. She was educated at Chowan College, Murfreesboro, N.C. and WMU Training School, Louisville, Kentucky. In 1935, she was appointed by the Foreign Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention to work in Hungary. She was transferred to Bucarest, Romania in 1936 and returned to Budapest, Hungary in 1938. Invasion by communism forced her to leave Hungary in 1942. Following this, she served as Dean of Women and Professor of Missionary

# Tax Assistance Available

As a part of his ongoing interest in volunteer activities in North Carolina, Governor Jim Hunt has proclaimed the month of February 1982, as "Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Month."

The proclamation recognized the many volunteers throughout the state who prepare income tax returns for low income and elderly and handicapped individuals who either cannot afford the services of a paid tax preparer, or who cannot visit an Internal Revenue Service office in person for assistance.

The volunteers, trained and sponsored by the IRS, are part of a program which has been active, ongoing

effort by the IRS since 1969. Volunteers come from all walks of life, including homemakers, certified public accountants, colleges, and high schools, IRS employees, accountants, and retired persons.

Low income, elderly, and handicapped taxpayers who wish to have their tax returns prepared free should call the IRS toll-free number 1-800-822-8800 and ask the location of the volunteer site nearest them. Although the month of February is an official "volunteer" month, the services are offered in most sites through April 15, 1982.

# Maritime Conference Is Planned

How have the sea and the coast affected North Carolina through the years? What does the future hold for the area?

The life of North Carolina coastal cultures and other aspects of North Carolina's maritime heritage will be explored during the second N. C. Maritime Heritage Conference March 5.

The day-long conference at Cape Fear Technical Institute in Wilmington will offer sessions dealing with early European exploration, the Lost Colony, underwater archaeology, ports and shipbuilding, contemporary maritime folklife and maritime art.

Among scheduled speakers are Michael Alford of Hampton Mariners Museum, Beaufort; John D. Broadwater, Virginia Historic Landmarks

Commission; Robert Byington and Alan D. Watson, UNC at Wilmington; Bruce Cheeseman, N. C. Division of Archives and History; and J. H. Parry, College of William and Mary and Harvard University.

Also Lawrence Lee, The Citadel; David B. Quinn, St. Mary's College (Maryland) and the University of Liverpool; John Sands, the Mariners Museum, Newport News; and William N. Still and Gordon Watts, East Carolina University.

The conference is open to the public. Registration is \$3 until February 25; after February 25, \$8. The conference begins with an optional social hour from 5-8 P.M. on March 4, at N.C. Marine Resources Center, Fort Fisher. Lunch Friday will be at the Wilmington

Hilton. An extra charge will be made for the social hour and lunch.

The conference is sponsored by the Archaeology and Historic Preservation Section, an agency of the Department of Cultural Resources; Ft. Fisher Marine Resources Center; Cape Fear Technical Institute; New Hanover County Museum; University of N. C. at Wilmington; and USS North Carolina Battleship Commission.
