Miss Jones, a 1982 Visiting Artist at Catawba Valley Technical College in

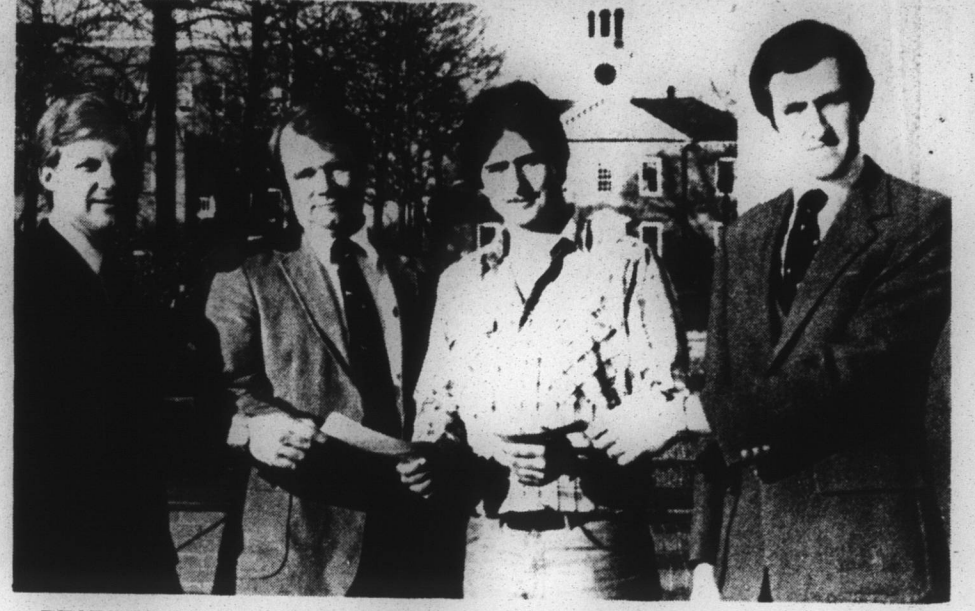
Hickory, specializes in opera, oratorio, and recital. She has several years of college-level teaching experience in applied voice. The artist also performs with her brother and sister-in-law as the Cantilena Ensemble.

She began her career after earning bachelor and masters degrees in vocal performance from the

University of Tennessee. Later, she was accepted into the Professional Studies program at the Juilliard School, studying under former Metropolitan Opera star, Eleanor Steber. Miss Jones has dedicated herself to capturing

audiences who attend her concerts and recitals to experience her outstanding qualities. She has sung roles as "Violetta" in "La Traviata" with the Nassau Long Island Symphony in New York; "Michaela" in "Carmen" with the Brevard

Music Center in North Carolina; the oratorios "Haydn Creation" with the Spartanburg Symphony in Clinton, South Carolina; and "Messiah" with North-eastern Bible College in Essex Falls, New Jersey.


