The Committee on Renewal Through Evangelism (CORE) will meet on Wednesday, February 24, 7:30 P.M., in the church library.

"Reflections of His Love", a new film highlighting the life and ministry of Joni Eareckson, a quadriplegic, will be shown at the Edenton United Methodist Church, Sunday, February 28, 7 P.M. The public is invited to attend.

Democratic State Executive Committee convenes in Raleigh on Saturday, according to Party Chairman Russell Walker.

"The party is honored to have a distinguished public servant who is one of our own number on the program," Walker said in making the announcement. A major item of business on the day's agenda is the election of six participants

and four replacements to represent North Carolina at the National Democratic Party's Mid-year Conference in Philadelphia on June 25-26. Approximately 30 Democrats have filed notice of candidacy for election to those positions.

Morgan was elected to a six-year term in the U. S. Senate in 1974. He previously had served six years as Attorney General

of North Carolina for six years and was elected to five terms in the State Senate. He served that body as president pro tem in 1965.

Among Democrats, Morgan is known to be a

strong advocate of the tobacco program and of better housing for low-income farm families. He is currently engaged in the practice of law in his own firm in Lillington.
