

Seniors To Receive Magazine

High school seniors in Beaufort, Hyde, Washington, and Tyrrell counties will be receiving a very valuable document about the middle of March, compliments of Beaufort County Community College. 18 Almanac, a nationally-distributed magazine designed to help high school seniors make higher-education decisions, will be distributed to each member of the senior class in the nine high schools in this area. Containing information about college-choice decisions, career tracks, types of institutions, hints for leaving home or living away from home, the magazine is written with both the student and the parent in mind.

Since this is essentially a nationally-distributed magazine, information is included about almost all types of institutions, whether public or private, and whether national, regional, or local. Factors for students and parents to consider in making career choices are also treated.

The center section of the magazine contains specific information about programs of study available at Beaufort County Community College and statements from some current students about their studies and their reasons for choosing Beaufort County Community College.

Lost Colony Auditions Slated

MANTEO — Auditions for the 1982 Joe Layton Production of Paul Green's "The Lost Colony" will be held here February 27, at 2 P.M. The Manteo auditions will be in "The Lost Colony" activity building adjacent to the Elizabethan Gardens on the Fort Raleigh National Historic Site.

"We are resuming a tradition that has been lost over the years," said Robert Knowles, associate producer-general manager, of holding the Manteo auditions first.

"We will be auditioning for all parts with the exception of those that are already filled by commitments from returning cast members," he added. Those attending the auditions are required to bring a photograph and a resume. Procedure for auditioning is as follows:

Acting positions: Potential cast members should prepare two minutes of memorized dialogue of their choice.

Singing positions: Prepare two minutes of singing of your choice.

Dancing positions: Potential dancers will be included in a dance movement class led by an instructor from "The Lost Colony" production staff. No prepared material is necessary.

Children will be auditioned. Potential cast members under 18 years of age required to have their own housing. "The Lost Colony" is unable to provide housing for anyone under the age of 18 years.

Additional auditions will be held by the Southeastern Theater Conference, March 5-7, in Louisville, Ky. Also, auditions are scheduled March 27 at the Institute of Outdoor Drama in Chapel Hill. Write: Institute of

Attendance at one of the three auditions for a personal interview is required to become a member of "The Lost Colony" company. Rehearsals for the 42nd production season of "The Lost Colony" begin on May 24. America's first symphonic outdoor drama plays June 11 through August 28, nightly except Sundays.
