

## Membership Drive Is Underway

MANTEO—The Roanoke Island Historical Association has started its 1982 campaign for new and renewal memberships.

Rep. and Mrs. Charles Evans of Nags Head are directing the campaign this year. The RIHA has been the producing organization of "The Lost Colony" since its inception in 1937.

The 1982 Joe Layton production of Paul Green's "The Lost Colony" will play June 11 through August 28, nightly except Sundays, here at Waterside Theater.

Producing "The Lost Colony" is the main thrust of the RIHA. However, the association is actively involved in many other projects such as: offering a Professional Theater Workshop (PTW), under the direction-guidance of director-choreographer Layton, to members of the company cast. The drama's production staff provides classroom work in all aspects of the theater. In addition, guest teachers from all over the United States and abroad, each a professional in his or her own right, are featured. PTW also sponsors "The Lost Colony" Children's Theatre, which performs Wednesday and Saturday mornings, July through mid-August at the Marine Resources Center.

The RIHA operates "The Lost Colony" Craft Shop; is actively involved in the planning of America's 400th Anniversary Celebration (1984-87); works closely with the National Park Service and the Elizabethan Gardens in celebrations and activities related to the first English attempts to settle the New World. One of the latest projects of the association is the placement of a memorial bust of playwright Paul Green in the Waterside Theater.

"We have as our goal a representative membership from all of North Carolina's 100 counties," said Evans. "Of course, we would be very pleased if our friends outside of North Carolina continued their wonderful support of the association" he added.

"We have county representatives and regional directors who are assisting us in the drive. With the 400th Anniversary Celebration (1984-87) just around the corner, it is becoming increasingly important to support the activities of the Roanoke Island Historical Association," Evans added.
