The Following Reasons Were Presented In Support Of The Propositions...

# Proposition A...

1. Refund from VEPCO to the Town of Edenton was for WHOLESALE charge only, which was NOT passed on to the retail customer to any appreciable amount.

2. The North Carolina Division of Environmental Management has instructed that Edenton can not place any additional requirements on the present overloaded sewer system. What that means is that there can be ...

a. NO NEW HOMES

b. NO NEW BUSINESSES

c. NO NEW INDUSTRY d. NO EXPANSIONS TO ANY OF THE ABOVE.

3. No new industrial employment opportunities able to locate in Edenton.

4. Lower future tax requirements sewer system improvements if all funds retained.

# Proposition B...

- 1. Industrial and commercial customers account for approximately the same amount of usage residential customers and the commercial customers are paying a higher rate.
- 2. Calculation of equitable distribution would not incur an unreasonable cost to the town.
- 3. Commercial and industrial users provide the bulk of the jobs for all our citizens.
