## Southeastern Graphics Display

Approximately 30 prints showing a variety of techniques and imagery will be on view Feb. 14 - Mar. 21 in the Collectors Gallery of the N. C. Museum of Art in Raleigh. An opening reception will be held on Feb. 14 from 4 to 6 P.M.

Titled "Southeastern Graphics Invitational 1981: Prints," the show includes etchings, lithographs, wood engravings, woodcuts, photo-etching, and serigraphs. It was organized by Jane Kessler, assistant curator of exhibitions at the Mint Museum in Charlotte. A catalogue accompanies the exhibition.

The work of Greenville artist Donald Sexauer is represented in "The Construct an Angel." The color intaglio shows a manmade angel being hoisted toward awaiting wings. Surrounding

the golden tones of the primary images are blueprint diagrams for the angel's construction. Scribbled across the blueprint are mischievous comments from the artist's peers on how the project might be better accomplished.

Charlotte artist Paul Harcharik's work includes "Folded Archdale No. 14," a monotype showing a folded shirt. Its flatness is rendered in monochromatic gray stripes.

John Thomas Maggio of Greensboro uses a complicated process of cut stencil lithograph over serigraph for "Three Down Six to Go." Multi-colored letter-like shapes emerge through the cutouts in the rich blue lithograph. Though the shapes are actually

behind the lithograph, they appear to float before it with the blue receding into a backdrop.

Other North Carolina artists in the exhibition are Don Byrum, Charlotte; Ann Conner, Wilmington; Michael Ehlbeck, Greenville; Herb Jackson, Davidson; and Kurt Warnke, Belmont.

After the exhibition closes in Raleigh, it will travel to James Madison University, Harrisonburg, Va.; East Carolina University, Greenville; and the Hunter Museum, Chattanooga, Tenn.
