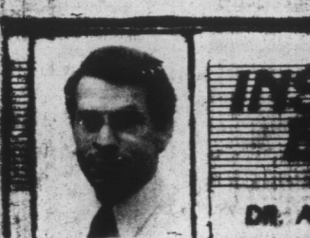

Checkups: how often?
