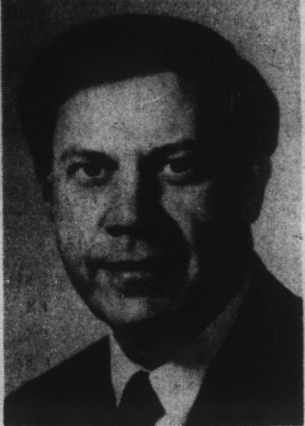


## Revival To Be Held

## New State Fishing Records Are Set

Six state fishing records were set in North Carolina last year, five in fresh water and one in salt water. New marks were set at Oak Hollow Lake near High Point, at Falls Reservoir near Badin, in Alarka Creek (a tributary to Fontana Reservoir in Swain County), in a farm pond near Charlotte, at Lake Adger in Polk County, and near Topsail Island.

## Objections Are Raised

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — The National Cotton Council has raised a strong objection to the National Weather Service's proposed elimination of its agricultural weather program in fiscal 1983.

The proposal is included in the agency's budget recommendations now being considered by a House Science and Technology subcommittee chaired by Rep. James H. Scheuer (D-N.Y.).

Council President Edward Breihan of Lubbock, Tex., in a letter to the subcommittee chairman this week, described the program as "highly valuable" to farmers as well as consumers.

"It saves farmers hundreds of millions of dollars each year," Breihan stated, "and also means untold additional savings to consumers in terms of increased production and lower prices."

growing consensus that such block grants based on proportionate OCS revenues should proceed independently of other OCS-related legislation.

The bill will serve to preserve funding for valuable ocean resources which are otherwise threatened by federal budget cuts. It will also provide an incentive for greater participation among coastal states in oil and gas development on the Outer Continental Shelf.

The major provisions of the bill include:

- Retaining the National Sea Grant College program;
- Providing of block grants to coastal states to maintain coastal zone management, coastal energy impact, ocean fisheries and living marine resources program, and for the enhancement and management of state natural resources;
- Providing such coastal states with a greater degree of flexibility in the application of the grants.

The fund would be based only on the increment in federal Outer Continental Shelf revenues resulting from the acceleration of our offshore program. Fiscal Year 1982 would be used as the base, with the fund composed of an amount equal to only 10 per cent of the growth in revenues from OCS bonuses and royalties, with a ceiling of \$300-million.

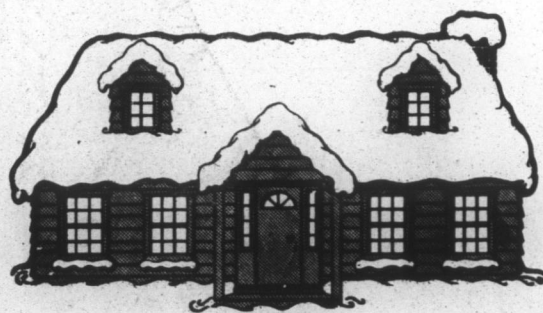

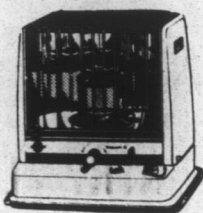
