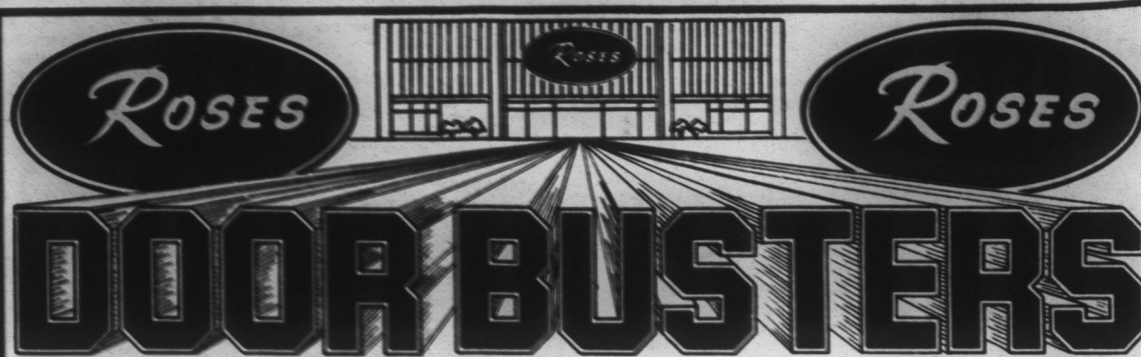
Toppin expressed the Legion's pleasure over the hope and promise that now exist in Jamaica under the leadership of Prime Minister Edward Seaga.
