He was so upset about seeing the black boys and girls out of school until he made it his duty to find the boys and girls playing hooky from school, to talk to them and their parents to keep the boys and girls off the street and in school. He was also the first to start the Joy Fund for the sick and shut-ins, John R. Page Lodge No. 13. At that time Mr. William Reeves past master appointed past master W. H. Collins permanent chairman of the Joy Fund committee which is still going on today. 310 people received Christmas cards and presents.

Mr. Reeves also worked at the Chowan Herald for several years. He is also working in his church and community and has been in inspiration to our town.

Everyone is invited to come worship during these meetings.

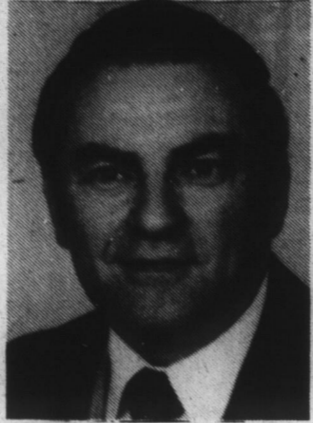
Methodist Topic
