Eleven Make COA Dean's List

Eleven Chowan County residents earned scholastic averages that merited the inclusion of their names on the Dean's List at College of The Albemarle during the Winter Quarter. Norman L. Norfleet, dean of instruction, announced this week that 171 students earned the honor.

The list represents 12.9 per cent of the 1,325 curriculum students who were enrolled at COA during the winter session. Chowan scholars comprised 6.4 per cent of those receiving recognition.

Norfleet explained that in order to become eligible, students must complete a minimum of 12 quarter-

hours of course work, with a 3.25 (B+) or better grade point average, and no grade below "C". The highest possible GPA is 4.0.
