Renaissance Era Topic Of COA Lecture

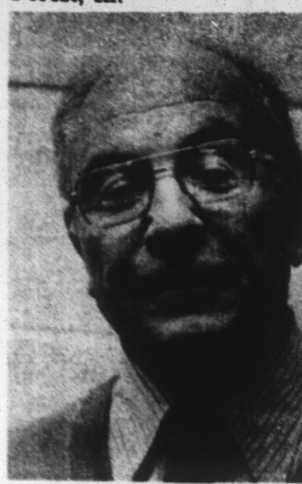
The famous voyages of discovery, another gift from the Renaissance, will be the subject of discussion during the next-to-last session "The Human Dimension" humanities series at 7:30 P.M. on March 30, at College of The Albemarle.

Well-known local scholar, Dr. Louis V. Nadeau, professor of philosophy at Elizabeth City State University, will present the lecture. His discussion will describe the excitement of the times as man experienced a physical expansion of his terrestrial horizons through the discovery of new lands.

More exciting were the discoveries of Copernicus, Galileo, and Kepler, according to Nadeau. His discourse will reveal many of the emotions of these Renaissance astronomers, who were the first to glimpse worlds beyond man's reach.

Nadeau, who has been associated with ECSU since 1970, holds several degrees,

including masters in biology, philosophy and theology. He earned his doctorate in 1952 from Aquinas Institute in River Forest, Ill.

The lecturer traveled and studied extensively in Europe and Africa for 15 years. He was the education supervisor for the Diocese of Sokoto in North Nigeria from 1956 until 1965, and served as rector and dean of

studies at the Seminary of SS. Peter and Paul in Ibadan, Nigeria from 1965 through 1969.

His education encompasses a wide range of disciplines from the study of chemistry, embryology, mathematics, physics, and history at several of the country's leading universities, to French literature at the Alliance of Franciase in Paris.

Nadeau holds professional memberships in the

American Philosophical Association, Community Humanities Faculty of North Carolina, and the Southern Association of Africanists. He has been the recipient of several honors and awards, including his election in 1957, as a Fellow of the American Association

for the Advancement of Science. He is the author of more than a dozen scholarly articles and papers which have been published in education journals and textbooks. He has co-authored a number of treatises with colleagues.
