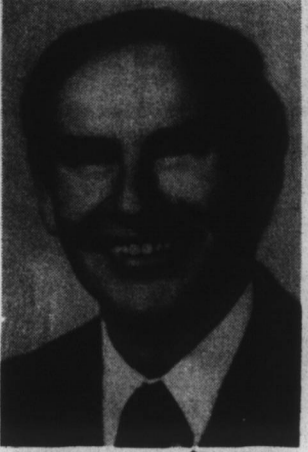


Montague Announces His Candidacy

Bert M. Montague, 58-year-old Raleigh attorney, is a candidate for nomination to the N. C. Court of Appeals. The seat he is seeking is a vacancy created by the announced retirement of Chief Judge Naomi Morris.



A native of Wake County, Montague graduated from Wake Forest College and the Wake Forest Law School. He is a retired colonel in the Air Force Reserve. A veteran of World War II, he served as a Fighter Pilot and was decorated in the European Theatre. He is married to the former Inez Hood of Zebulon, and they have four children.

After World War II and subsequent graduation from law school, Montague entered the private practice of

law in Raleigh. Soon thereafter, he accepted a position with the Attorney General as revisor of statutes. In 1966, he entered the field of judicial administration by accepting employment as administrative assistant to the Chief Justice. While serving in that capacity, he also functioned as the Executive Secretary of the Judicial Council.

With the advent of court reform and the resulting unification of the courts and centralization of management, Montague became the first assistant director of the newly established Administrative Office of the Courts under Judge J. Frank Huskins. In 1968, he received an appointment as the state court administrator. Active in this capacity, he served as a member of the State Constitution Study Commission of 1968, the Governor's Crime Commission, the Commission on Youth Services, the Courts Commission, and the Judicial Planning Committee, among others. Since 1974, he has been a member of the board of directors of the State Employees' Credit Union, serving as chairman of the board from 1979-1981.

Because of the pioneering court reform work being done in North Carolina, Montague has long been a nationally recognized advocate of court unification and management. He was advisor to court study

projects in numerous states; chairman of the National Court Statistics Project Committee; served on the executive committee of the Conference of State Court Administrators; the Council of State Court Representatives of the National Center for State Courts; and as chairman of the National Conference of Court Administrative Officers.

A Baptist, Montague actively participates in church programs, and is a Sunday School teacher and former deacon at Calvary Church in Raleigh. He is a lifelong Democrat.

anyone intends to bring sweet potato material into North Carolina from the quarantined areas of South Carolina, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, Louisiana, Alabama, or Texas, they should check with the state department of agriculture in the particular state to determine the certification status of the area.

"We had a problem in 1970-71 when the weevil was found in North Carolina, but we were able to eliminate it with treatment and quarantine of storage areas," Graham said.

Glenn To Address Annual Democratic Gathering

America's first astronaut, U.S. Sen. John Glenn of Ohio, will address Democrats at the annual Jefferson - Jackson Day dinner on April 24, according to State Party Chairman Russell Walker.

The Jefferson - Jackson dinner is the Party's largest fund-raiser. This year's event is expected to attract nearly 2,000 Democrats to Raleigh for the dinner and other activities on the day's schedule.

Senator Glenn was the first man to orbit the earth in his "Friendship 7." During World War II he was a Marine Corp Pilot who flew fighters in 59 combat missions. He returned to

combat in the Korean conflict and flew another 90 missions. Before becoming one of the nation's first seven astronauts in 1959, Glenn set a supersonic transcontinental speed record, flying from Los Angeles to New York in three hours and 23 minutes. He retired from the Marines in 1965 as a full colonel.

Now a second term senator, Glenn is a member of the Senate Democratic Policy Committee. He also serves on the Foreign Relations and Government Affairs Committees and on the Special Committee on Aging.

Joining the Sen. and Gov.

Jim Hunt will be congressman, members of the Council of State, and elected officials from across North Carolina. Governor and Mrs. Hunt will receive Democratic faithfuls at a public reception at the

Mansion in the afternoon, and the dinner is scheduled at the Raleigh Civic Center at 7 P.M.

"With an outstanding speaker like Senator Glenn, we expect a lot of Democrats to be in Raleigh

for this day," said Chairman Walker. "I believe he will provide the keynote for a solid Democratic year in North Carolina. We're already seeing great enthusiasm in every area of North Carolina
