#### Commissioners' Actions Noted

The following actions were taken during the March 1st meeting of the Chowan County Board of Commissioners.  
Bruce Wackelin, Chairman of the County Bloodmobile Committee, presented the donation award for the month of November to the County employees.

The commissioners, with all members present, adopted the Child Restraint - Governor's Highway Safety Program Resolution. A request from the Health Systems Agency for a subsidy of \$629.00 was denied.

Funds totaling \$2,200 were approved for grading, lime, fertilizer and seed for the ballfield at Chowan Jr. High School.

The Commissioners approved the appointment and reappointment, respectively of Mary Nixon and Tony Webb to the Chowan County Planning Board.

Approval was given for the purchase of a second vehicle for the Sheriff's Department. Also, a request was approved for relief of taxes in the amount of \$77.33.

The commissioners scheduled a meeting for March 23 for the purpose of awarding bids for the Chowan Hospital expansion program.
