Here's Hope Revival '82

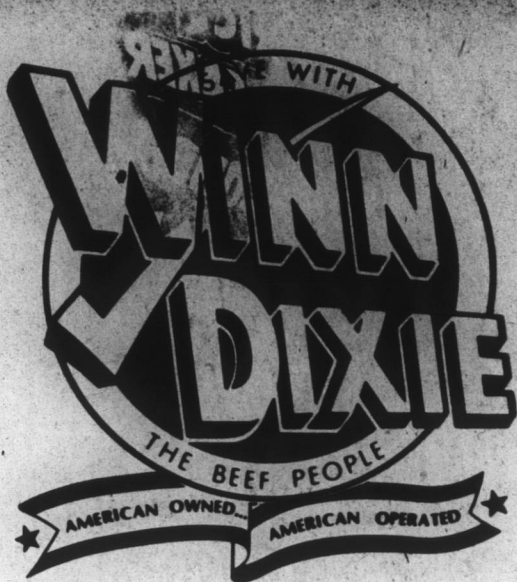
