

Washington Report: Budget Fight Still Lingers On

As much as I regret to report this, the United States Congress continues a stalemate regarding the budget proposed by President Reagan for fiscal '89. Certainly it is regrettable that some compromise cannot be accomplished in order that the Congress might proceed with

necessary legislation. One of the problems created by the failure to approve a budget is that the Appropriations Committee cannot function until they have Congressional approval of the amounts involved. I had occasion to contact Senator Jesse Helms one evening last week and he asked me what we were doing on the House side: and to be absolutely

honest I said as far as the Floor action practically nothing. I asked what they were doing on the Senate side and he replied they spent most of the day debating whether a Senator would have to be seated in his seat at the time he cast his votes! We both are concerned about the lack of action of both bodies.

This is not to imply that most Members aren't working full time. With the Committee work and especially those of us who serve as Chairmen, I can assure you there is little if any loss of motion. As an example of some of the problems which arise, I refer to the fact that each Subcommittee Chairman of each and every Committee submits a budget for the operation of his Subcommittee during a calendar year. The Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee has five subcommittees and the House Committee on Accounts in an effort to cut back spending reduced rather severely the total request made by my Committee. It then becomes my duty as Chairman to decide what proportion of the cuts each Subcommittee will absorb. This unpleasant action occurred last week and I now have for the moment

some Subcommittee Chairmen who to say the least are unhappy. I mention this to show some of the problems confronting a Member of Congress are not confined solely to the votes cast on the different legislative issues.

Also during the past week I set in motion plans for the full Committee on Merchant Marine and Fisheries to visit Dare County to conduct hearings on June 11 regarding the tentative consideration of the United States Navy to sink several decommissioned nuclear subs off the Carolina coast. As I have stated before, until I am absolutely satisfied that this action will cause no danger now or at some future date, then I shall continue to oppose this Naval proposal. I am under the impression that some of the Naval officials are opposing the hearing being held in Dare County and think it should be at some neutral site. I certainly see no justification for this opposition nor do I intend to change my plans to hold these hearings in Dare County on June 11.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Plymouth Fiber Group (pulp, paper and paperboard) has received the Award of Honor for 1981, the National Safety Council's highest award for outstanding safety achievement.

Plymouth Fiber's lost-time injury incident rate in 1981 was five times lower than the average rate for the entire pulp-and-paper industry. The industry averaged 2.62 lost-time injuries per 200,000 manhours worked, and Plymouth Fiber averaged .51 incidents per 200,000 manhours worked.

The 2200 tons-per-day fiber mill has about 1,700 employees who work more than 3,000,000 manhours a year.

The Martin Community College CPR certification class will be offered each week until all who want to take the course have had the opportunity.

The company is paying all registration fees for both employees and their spouses, who volunteer to take the course.
