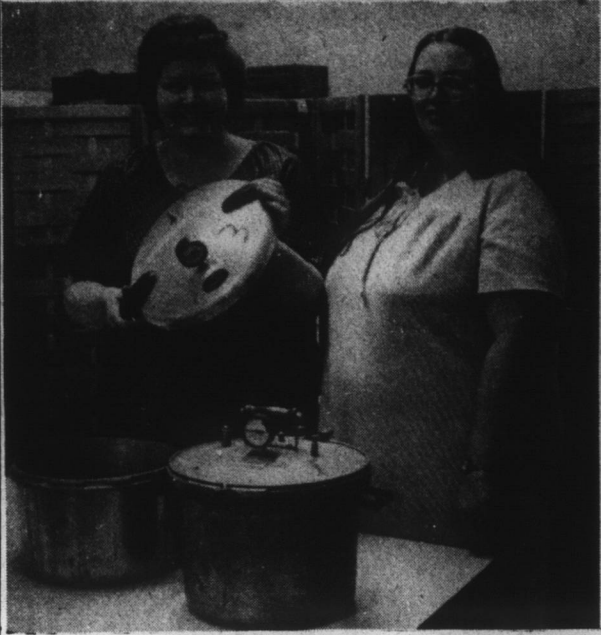
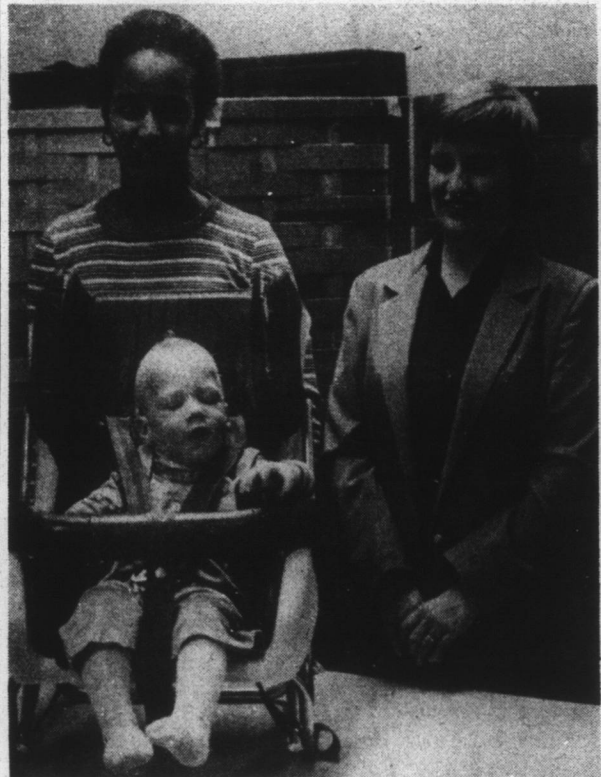


May Play Day

Hilton Head Island, S.C. by the Ralph Toon Associates of Atlanta, Ga.

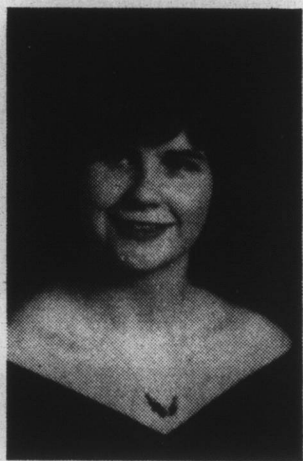
