J. Clarence Leary was elected president of The Chamber of Commerce and Merchants Association, succeeding J. G. Campen.

Three Chowan County boys enlisted in the Navy. They were: Frank Vernon White, Ralph Weldon Ward and James William Cates.

The fifth session of The Scout Masters training course was held at the Scout Cabin for the West Albemarle District.

John A. Holmes, secretary of The Edenton Rotary Club, was elected governor for the 189th Rotary district.

Church services were being planned for the day of the invasion of Europe.

T. C. Byrum was appointed as the manager for the Chowan County campaign of Gregg Cherry, candidate for Governor.

Mayor Leroy Haskett called a meeting of the County Commissioners and Town Council to take the necessary steps in providing the town with public toilets.

Robert Earl Edwards and Ethel Ann Swets were the finalists for the Annual State-wide high school debating contest.

Jasper L. Wiggins, former mayor of Edenton, presented a series of articles in reference to prominent Edentonians who had gone to their reward.

New officers were installed into the Edenton Woman's Club. They were: Mrs. Ben Perry, recording

secretary; Mrs. Richard Goodwin, president; succeeding Mrs. Frank Holmes; Mrs. W. J. P. Earnhardt, vice president; Miss Kathryn Brown, treasurer, and Mrs. Richard Dixon, Jr., historian.

"An Edenton institution that has been a beacon in the long history of the city and county is in danger of going out of existence as a public landmark, unless citizens of the city and county rally to its support. It is the Cupola House. For many years, since 1758 when it was built by Frances Corbett agent for the Lords Proprietors, the old house has reflected the traditions and history of Edenton, Chowan County and the Albemarle." "The original members of the Cupola Association were Frank Wood, W. D. Pruden, Sr., C. S. Vann, J. G. Wood, Mrs. Anne Shepard Graham, Mrs. Anne Wood Pruden, the Rev. R. B. Drane, J. H. McMullan, Jr., Richard Dillard and J. N. Pruden."

Raleigh attorney Sidney S. Eagles, Jr., is a candidate for the N.C. Court of Appeals seat being vacated by Judge Robert Martin. A partner in the Raleigh law

Attor. Gen. Rufus Edmisten. Active in Democratic party, N.C. Bar, church and civic activities, he managed Senator Robert Morgan's

American Bar Association, N.C. State Bar, the N.C. Bar Association, the North Carolina Academy of Trial Lawyers, the Wake County Academy of Criminal Defense Attorneys, and the Wake County Bar Association, Eagles has been an adjunct professor at the Campbell University School of Law and a lecturer at numerous legal seminars sponsored by the bar association and trial lawyers groups. He has served as an adjunct faculty member in Criminal Justice at Duke University's Institute of Policy Science.

While serving on the Attorney General's staff, from 1967 - 1971, Eagles was Revisor of Statutes and Secretary to the North Carolina General Statutes Commission. Later he served as head of the Attorney General's Legislative Drafting Service (1970 - 74) and thereafter (1974 - 76) lead the Special Prosecution's Division which tried especially complex criminal cases and otherwise assisted prosecutors across North

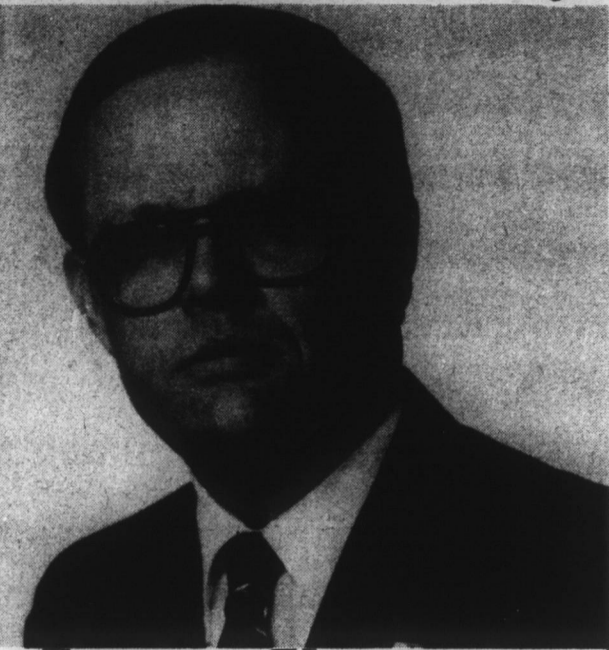
Carolina. In addition, Eagles has been an active member and participant in the work of the North Carolina Criminal Code Commission since its creation in 1969. The Commission, appointed by North Carolina's Attorney General, is a criminal law reform group which has prepared revisions of criminal procedure law adopted in 1975 and in 1977 by the North Carolina General Assembly.
