

### Scott Opens New Firm

Former Gov. Robert W. Scott and former State Utilities Commissioner Ben E. Roney of Rocky Mount have opened a consulting firm, Scott - Roney Public Affairs, in Raleigh.

The firm will serve business and industrial companies in their relationships with government at the state and federal levels. Both men are veteran political and business leaders with governmental experience in Raleigh and Washington.

Scott, a resident of Haw River, was lieutenant governor of North Carolina from 1965 to 1969 and Gov. from 1969 to 1973. He was in Washington from 1977 to 1979 as Federal Co-Chairman of the Appalachian Regional Commission.

Roney is a longtime associate of Scott, serving as his administrative assistant during his term as Gov. Roney served in the same capacity for Scott's father, the late W. Kerr Scott, who was Gov. from 1949 to 1953. The elder Scott served in the U.S. Senate from 1954 to 1958, with Roney again serving as his administrative assistant. From 1961 to 1965, Roney was director of the Sec-

dary Roads Program of the State Highway Commission. He was a member of the N.C. Utilities Commission from 1973 to 1979.

Scott is a former chairman of the Education Commission of the States, an honorary life member of the North Carolina League of Municipalities and recipient of the Distinguished Service Award of the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners.

The offices of Scott - Roney Public Affairs are located at 2245 North Hills Drive in Trailwood Office Center, near Crabtree Valley Mall.

### Coast Guard Cutter To Visit

Coast Guard Cutter Eagle, the U.S. Coast Guard's three-masted sailing barque, will visit Hampton Roads for the annual Norfolk Harborfest June 11 - 14.

The 295-foot sailing ship will lead a parade of sailing vessels from Cape Henry to Norfolk at 10 A.M., June 11. Eagle will dock at Freemason Harbor, Norfolk, about noon.

Eagle will be open for public visiting from 11 A.M. to 4 P.M. June 12 and from

11 A.M. to 5 P.M. June 13. Special visiting for the handicapped will be held from 3 to 4:30 P.M. June 11.

The ship will depart Norfolk at 9 A.M. June 14 for a stop in Philadelphia. Eagle's last visit to Hampton Roads was during the 1979 Harborfest.

### Apology Is Requested

N.C. Democratic Chairman Russell Walker has called on Sen. Jesse Helms to apologize to the people of North Carolina for his lone vote against a Senate resolution backing the Great Britain in its dispute with Argentina.

"North Carolinians back the British people and their government. We have been traditional allies for generations. It's embarrassing to have an elected North Carolina senator as the only spokesman for Argentina. It should tell Senator Helms something when even John East didn't vote on his side. Nor did any other senator, Republican or Democrat." The Democratic chair-

man said that he and other North Carolinians consider England "the other great democracy in the world, where people share many of the values that we hold in high esteem here in the United States. Argentina is run by a 'junta' which, I understand means a sort of three-man dictatorship. "I'm told Sen. Helms has visited Argentina three times, and apparently he liked what he saw down there. But this is a country where thousands of citizens have disappeared, never to be seen again. It's not our kind of free nation."
