

HIGHLIGHTS

Weyerhaeuser Company has announced that it has increased production capacity by 50 per cent at its large wood treating operation here that serves markets from North Carolina throughout the northeastern United States.

"The initial facility here was built less than three years ago, but demand for our pressure treated wood products dictated this significant expansion now, even in today's depressed economy," said Norman E. Johnson, vice president of Weyerhaeuser's North Carolina Region.

"Almost a third of the wood products sold in Europe are treated, and the American consumer is rapidly catching on to the economic advantages of going with treated wood to begin with, rather than having to replace untreated wood," Johnson added.

"Most wood used near ground contact or exposed

to elements should be pressure treated. It will last up to 10 times longer. The slightly higher initial cost for treated wood is only a fraction of the replacement cost for untreated wood, and is certainly worth the difference," he said.

Weyerhaeuser's North Carolina plant treats Southern pine wood products, such as lumber, plywood, exterior siding panels and landscape timbers, with chromated copper arsenate (CCA).

The plant production capacity is 52-million board feet of lumber, more than 40,000 sheets of plywood and exterior designer siding, and two million landscape timbers a year.

CCA is a waterborne treatment which, after it dries, allows sanding, painting or staining of the treated product, unlike other treatments such as penta and creosote, which are petroleum-based.

This type of treated wood has a green color at first and will rapidly weather naturally to a silvery wood color, if left unpainted and unstained.

CCA treated pine products are also very competitive with the traditional cedar and redwood products.

Wood products are treated with different levels of CCA for specific uses. Consumers should look for an American Wood Preservers Bureau (AWPB) inspection stamp printed on the products to make certain that they are getting properly treated wood.

Wood products should be treated to .40, or LP 22, for most applications, which means that there is .4 of a pound of chemical in each cubic foot of wood. A .60, or FDN, treatment has to be used for foundations and basements.

Weyerhaeuser, the world's largest lumber producer, recommends using CCA pressure treated products for exterior portions of wooden buildings, such as eaves and trim, and in basement and foundation applications, as well as for decks, landscaping, outdoor furniture and fences.

Choir To Perform At World's Fair

MURFREESBORO — The Chowan College Touring Choir will perform at the 1982 World's Fair in Knoxville, Tenn., as part of its spring tour that also will take it to six Baptist churches in North Carolina and Tennessee.

The choir was one of 145 Baptist choirs chosen to perform in the centrally located Baptist pavilion at the World's Fair. The choir will deliver two 20-minute performances on the pavilion stage on May 18 at 11:45 A.M. and 12:20 P.M.

The Baptist Ministries for the 1982 World's Fair program screening committee chose the 145 choirs, representing 16 states, from a pool of 247 Baptist choirs who auditioned through cassette tapes. The selec-

tions were completed in January, 1982.

The choir's director, Dr. James Chamblee, said the choir's first appearance will be at the Mount Hermon Baptist Church of Durham on Sunday evening, May 16.

Other evening concerts will be presented at the First Baptist Church of Seymour, Tenn. on May 17; First Baptist Church of Piedmont, Tenn., May 18; First Baptist Church, Greenville, Tenn., May 19; First Baptist Church, Yadkinville, May 20; and Temple Baptist Church, Raleigh, May 21.

Dr. Chamblee said the choir consists of 19 singers (seven men and 12 women)

representing five states: North Carolina, Virginia, New Jersey, Delaware and Pennsylvania.

The Chowan Touring Choir has performed extensively throughout the Southeastern United States, from Florida to Delaware. This will be its first tour in Tennessee.

Chowan is one of seven colleges related to the Baptist State Convention of North Carolina. The college has operated in the black for the past 23 years under the administration of Dr. Bruce E. Whitaker, who is completing his 25th year as president.


