One interesting side-note is that the North Carolina Association of Educators might have set themselves up for at least a slight fall. The Association is a lobbying group for North Carolina teachers--basically to get teachers more money and fringe benefits.

Lately the group has been very involved with lobbying for ERA passage. But in this June session, if the lawmakers get too involved in the haggle over ERA, they may not have the time to look for means of getting enough money to maintain the five per cent pay raise of last year and the teacher "step" increases now in effect.
