It is an educational program which was designed to allow students and their teachers to interact with state officials, legislators, representatives from the news media, lobbyist organizations, etc. through panel discussions, seminars, question and answer sessions, etc. The program is modeled after the highly successful National CLOSE UP program which provided opportunities for teachers and students to use Washington as a classroom in the same manner that Raleigh is used for the North Carolina program.

When high blood pressure is not treated, there can be serious damage to blood vessels that feed the heart, the brain, and the kidneys. The blood cannot flow freely when this happens. As the heart is made to pump harder, it can become too large. It may just stop. Blood vessels in the brain may burst. That can lead to what we call a stroke. If the kidneys are damaged, they can no longer clean the blood. Disease and death may follow. High blood pressure is the major cause of heart attacks, strokes, and kidney disease.
