Foxwell will appear in the United States Achievement

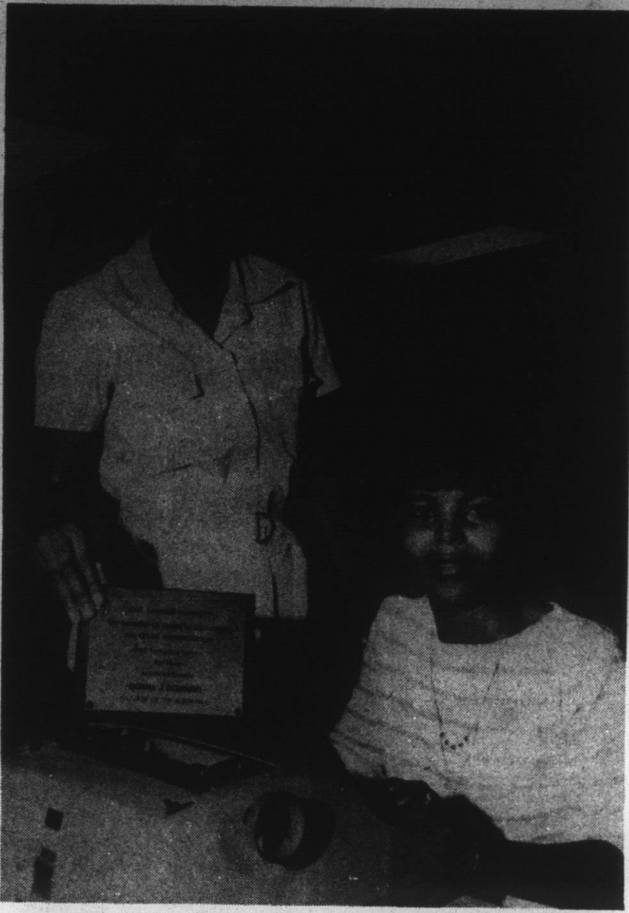
Academy Official Yearbook, published nationally.
