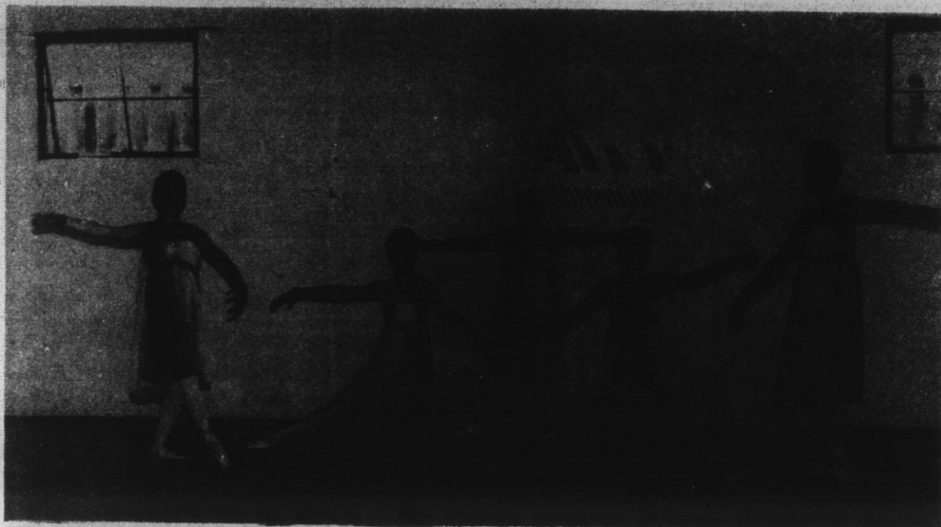
## Topic Is Chosen
