Johnny Won't Tell You

If your child has a vision problém, chances are he won't tell you or even be aware of it himself. More than likely he's been seeing the same way ever since he was born. Dental Disease Not Inherited

We can break the chain of tooth decay. Today, dental disease is totally preventable. Bad teeth may "run in the family", but there is just no hereditary excuse for cavities, pyorrhea and crooked teeth. What we do pass down from generation to generation are bacteria, eating habits, muscular patterns, attitudes toward oral cleanliness, etc.


If grandmother had a history of dental problems, maybe it was because she nor her parents did not know how to take care of her teeth. If grandfather wore dentures, it may be because he lived at a time when teeth were extracted to "cure" all kinds of ailments from rheumatism to poor eyesight. But your own child has been born in an age of prevention. If he or

she has eight cavities by age five, it will be because somebody has failed to do something. Today's preventive

dental knowledge calls for a four-way effort to break the chain of decay through new approaches to bacterial control, diet, oral hygiene, and strengthening the resistance of teeth to decay. It will take time, caring and effort, but we can defeat dental decay in children if we really work at it.
