Chowan Hospital was the CPR training center on May 20 for 23 Soil Conservation Service employees.

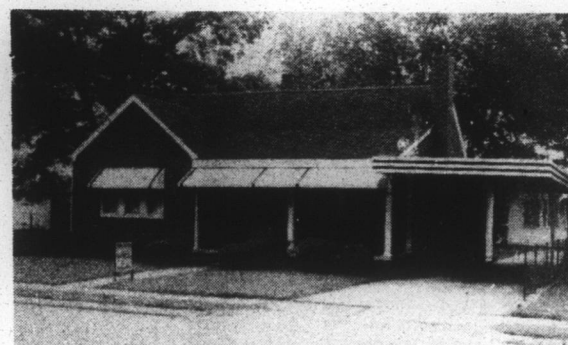
