# The Carolina Review: ERA Backlash Is Continuing

WHO IS WRONG?... "I know he's usually right on such things, but he's wrong on this one. He's as wrong as he can be."

Those were the words of a North Carolina senator who voted against the ERA ratification bill week-before-last, though heavily lobbied by the governor to support the bill.

"What about the Lou Harris poll?" the senator was asked.

"The questions must have been slanted or something—cause it's wrong too," he said.

The senator went on, "Listen, I was home last weekend (weekend after the vote) and I went to every meeting I could find. Everywhere, people were coming up to me and shaking my hand for the way I voted. Then they'd ask, 'What's wrong with Jim Hunt?'"

That particular senator had some fairly convincing evidence to back up his

words with 2,057 letters against the ERA and 775 supporting it.

Still, the governor wasn't wrong—just wrong—in his support of ERA, according to Hunt spokesman Brent Hackney.

"I'd believe the Lou Harris poll before I'd believe an orchestrated mailing," Hackney said.

Hackney maintains that the governor couldn't lose either way. "The governor really put himself on the line for something he believes in very deeply—and I don't think a whole lot of people will hold that against him," he said.

But there were admissions from the governor and his staff that some strained relations had arisen over the ERA controversy and related lobbying.

"It's been a very intense couple of weeks, and feelings run high on this issue," Hackney said.

The governor, however,

said he didn't expect the hard feelings to last very long.

At his weekly news conference, Gov. Hunt said the "tendency for things like this is for Democrats to get back together...and I expect it on this too."

The governor is probably right, but there are some pro-ERA people who don't intend to forgive and forget and they are making it pretty hard for the 27 "no" vote senators to do so either.

One person or persons sent the senators a poem, accompanied by a plastic bag containing a handful of chicken manure.

Another poem came from the N.C. Daughters for the Amendment Ratification and was enclosed with a lady's white glove. It read: "You hid in the chapel to say

You'd vow not pass ERA. Speed, under a pew,

Finds his chances are few. You'll see. ERA's here to stay."

That poem was a reference to a meeting held by the "no" voters in the legislative chapel to check the numbers for and against ERA lobbyist Betty McCain was reported to have said she found longtime senator, Jim Speed, hiding later on the floor between pews—

avoiding her. "Get up from there, you've got a bad back," she was reported to have said to him.

"That was never said, and I was never hiding on the floor between any pews either," Speed says.

Pondering who to believe, one observer summed it up. "Jim Speed don't hide," he said.

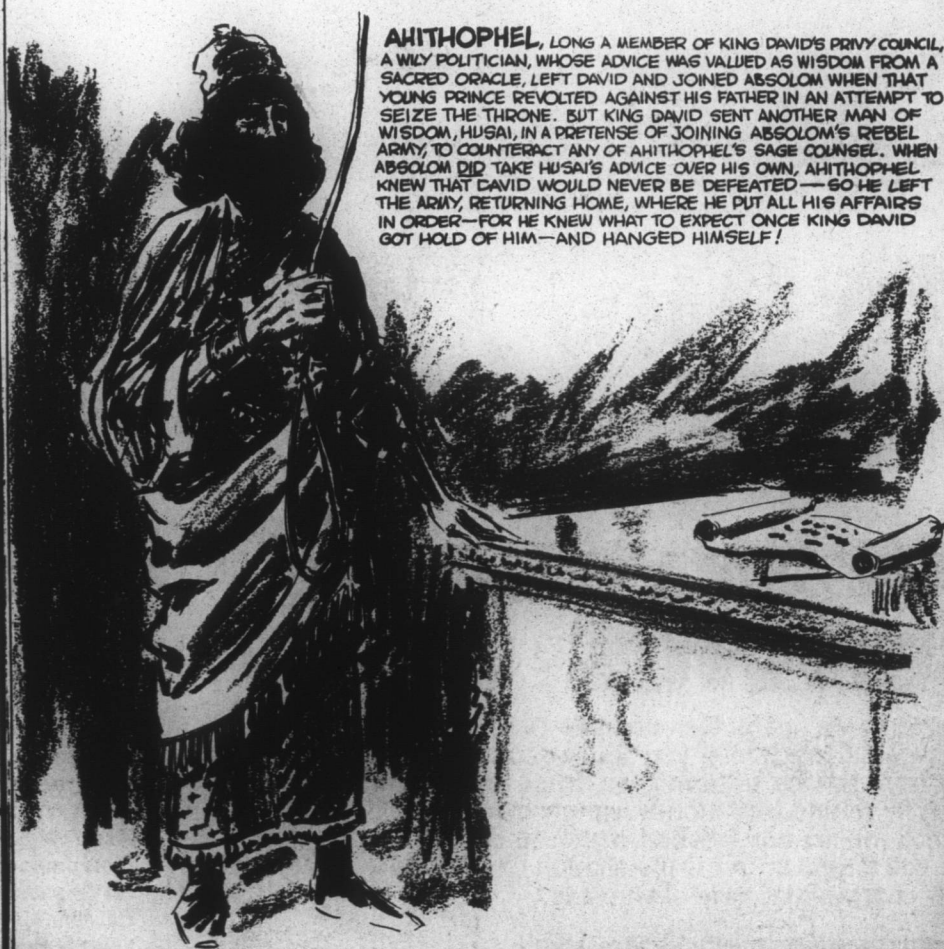
