Next we visited Winborne Brothers Farm and watermelon variety test. Oasis variety caught the attention of the touring group.


At the Alvin Evans Farm we saw a new corn picker and hydro cooler. Evans also showed how he crated cantaloupes for selling on the Baltimore market.






