LuAnn Jordan Wins First Recruitment Scholarship

Sarah LuAnn Jordan, of Hertford, N.C. was honored with the first Recruitment Scholarship given by PI Chapter Delta Kappa Gamma Society International. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Edward Jordan of Hertford. LuAnn was Valedictorian of her senior class at Albemarle Academy in 1979. She attended the College of The Albemarle and received the Kicklighter Memorial Award - Phi Theta Kappa in 1981. She has completed her junior year at East Carolina University where she is majoring in Special Education. After her graduation in 1983 she hopes to continue graduate work.

This Recruitment Grant Scholarship is set up to honor a N.C. high school graduate from the Albemarle Counties of Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Dare, Gates, Pasquotank, Perquimans and Tyrrell. The Grant is offered each year, on a competitive basis, to a female upcoming junior or senior college student who plans to major in education. Eligibility requirements include:

- (1.) Graduate of an Albemarle area high school
- (2.) Cumulative average of 3.0
- (3.) Demonstrate firm intention to pursue a degree in education, and
- (4.) Completion of two years of college work.

Morris Attending Transit Workshop

Urban Mass Transportation Administrator Arthur E. Teele, Jr., and Howard University President James E. Cheek recently announced 15 fellowship awards for a summer workshop in transportation-related studies for faculty members of predominately minority colleges and universities. It was designed to enhance the ability of the faculty members to conduct research on contemporary transit problems, and to reinforce their abilities to propose a wide range of research and development projects.

Coast Guard Funds Allocated

Washington, D.C.—The House of Representatives today passed H.R. 5617, the Coast Guard Authorization for fiscal years 1983 and 1984. The legislation authorizes \$1.842 billion in fiscal 1983 and \$2.026 billion in fiscal 1984 for operating expenses; \$670 million in fiscal 1983 and \$700 million in fiscal 1984 for acquisition, construction and improvements; \$30 million in fiscal 1983 and \$33 million in fiscal 1984 for research and development; and \$12.7 million in fiscal 1983 for alteration or removal of bridges. Additionally, H.R. 5617 authorizes \$144 million in supplemental funds for fiscal 1982 operating expenses.

Hon. Walter B. Jones, Chairman of the Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee and Floor Manager of H.R. 5617, expressed his support for the bill and stressed the importance of the Coast Guard's life-saving activities. Stated Jones, "I would ask that we remember that the Coast Guard is not an intangible, abstract budget line. It is an organization of dedicated men and women who literally risk their lives to provide a host of services to honor women who have given distinctive service in any field of education to advance the professional interest and position of women in education to initiate, endorse and support desirable legislation in the interest of education and of women educators to endow scholarships to aid outstanding women educators in pursuing graduate work and to grant fellowships to women educators from other countries to stimulate personal and professional growth of members and encourage their participation in appropriate programs of action to inform membership of current economic, social, political, and educational issues. With these purposes in mind and a current project for members to positively participate in improving the educational climate in N.C., we are proud to grant this honor to Ms. Jordan."

Overpayments Are Recovered

RALEIGH—The N.C. Employment Security Commission (ESU) recovered a total of \$477,891.82 in unemployment insurance overpayments during the two month period, May and June 1982, according to figures released today by the commission.

Ron Hawks, chief of the Benefit Payment Control Unit, announced that "we are now in a position to provide data on overpayments and recoveries in dollar amounts on a county-by-county basis. This information will be useful particularly for ESC managers and fraud investigators. With this data they can identify those areas which most effectively control the improper payment of benefits to which individuals are not legally entitled."

In the past two months, the unit investigated 1,157 persons who have claimed or currently are claiming unemployment insurance benefits. The investigations showed 694 (60 per cent) were overpaid \$203,955.06. The commission classified 293 cases as fraud and 401 as non-fraud. Fraud cases are classified as such when a claimant is proved to have knowingly made a false statement on a claim which resulted in overpayments. Non-fraud overpayments result generally from unintentional filing errors with which fraudulent intent cannot be associated.

During May and June, 83 persons were tried in state courts on charges of unemployment insurance fraud. All 83 were convicted. Guilty verdicts were rendered in 33 of the state's 100 counties. Mecklenburg had 11 guilty verdicts followed by Wake with seven and Gaston with six. Durham, Lee, Person and Randolph each had four. Guilford, New Hanover and Onslow had three. Twenty-three other counties had one or two guilty verdicts.
