

## August Celebrated As "Outdoors In The Sun"

August in North Carolina is being celebrated as "Outdoors In The Sun." The surf will be one of August's most favored tonics, a cure-all to heal a year's worth of jangled nerves.

One of the big events in August is the Shrimp Festival at Sneads Ferry, (Route 210 just south of Camp Lejeune) which will mark its 12th anniversary August 14, with 15-18,000 people expected. The event begins at 11 A.M. with a parade of some 100 units. At noon until 7 P.M. visitors will be served 2,500 pounds of shrimp and flounder, while 500 clams will make a delicious chowder. Proceeds go to the fire department and rescue squad for that area.

The N.C. Apple Festival in Hendersonville is August 24-September 6. Several events are scheduled, beginning August 24 at the Opportunity House with an Arts and Crafts Fair for three days. The big King Apple Parade is August 26. Two golf tournaments will take place at the Etowah Valley Golf Course with the women's tournament on the 25th and the men's tournament on the 28th. The Hendersonville YMCA will sponsor a tennis tournament and a road race August 28.

For the bicyclist, the North Carolina Bicycle Touring Society is sponsoring two events in August. One is set August 2 beginning at Blowing Rock with a 220 mile ride to the Peaks of Otter which is north of Roanoke, Virginia. On August 14 and 15 the society is also sponsoring the Great 'North Carolina' Bicycle

Balloon Chase at Tanglewood Park in Clemmons. This includes bike riding, camping, canoeing, horse backriding and a lecture on Saturday night.

A special event in the piedmont area of our state is the Sixth Annual Lazy Daze Arts and Crafts Show in Cary August 28. This year 300 artists and craftsmen from all over the southeastern United States will be at the Lazy Daze event. Some 20,000 people are expected.

If your favorite hobby or sport is fishing, good fishing days in August are August 15-21, according to the "Outdoors, North Carolina" calendar.

From the mountains to the sea, there is truly something fun for everyone "Outdoors in August."

## Courts Offer New Books

The Administrative Office of the Courts has made available two new sources of information which are designed to help witnesses and victims understand courtroom procedures.

The first, a "Witness-Victim Handbook," contains 11 pages of simple language descriptions of the trial courts' structure, the categories of criminal offenses, trial procedures, and suggestions to assist the witness in giving accurate, responsive testimony while minimizing the difficulties brought on by tension and unfamiliarity with the courts. The 34 District Attorneys will arrange for distribution of the handbook in the 100 counties.

"Witnesses should know what to expect in the courtroom and how to carry out their responsibilities in the trial of cases. We hope that these two sources of information will assist witnesses to avoid tension and confusion that they may experience due to unfamiliarity with the courtroom; and that they will help witnesses understand the vital importance of their role as 'citizen participants' in the operation of North Carolina's trial courts."

## Social Security

Women who change their name - whether because of marriage, divorce, or other reasons - should be certain to report the change to Social Security.

Employers report earnings under the name by which their employees are known.

If the workers' names are not listed correctly, their earnings may not be properly recorded, and they may not receive all the Social Security credit due them.

Even women who are not employed should report any name change so that their Social Security records will contain the correct name when they apply for benefits.

A name change should be reported on the "Application for a Social Security Number Card", which may be obtained from any Social Security office.

Proof of identity under both the old and new names will be required. Usually a certified copy of the marriage certificate will be sufficient proof of identity.

Additional information about reporting a change in name can be obtained from the Elizabeth City Social Security office by calling 338-2161.

The Carteret County town of Beaufort will host the sixth annual Strange Seafood Exhibition on August 19 at the Hampton Mariners Museum from 1-4 P.M. This nationally acclaimed event features more than thirty strange edible seafoods including octopus salad, conquina clam chowder, shark creole and mullet roe hors d'oeuvres.

Earlier in the month, mountain breezes will replace salt spray during the 55th annual Mountain Dance and Folk Festival August 5-7 at the Asheville Civic Center. The finest performers in the nation will compete for \$2,000 in prize money and trophies. Held in conjunction with the folk festival is the Shindig-On-the-Green every Saturday in August, except for August 5-7. Sponsored by the Asheville Chamber of Commerce, these shindigs held at the City County Plaza are outdoor gatherings of mountain traditional music makers and dancers, string and bluegrass music and clogging. Some 3,000 people attend each week.

Herpetologists from around the world will converge on Raleigh August 1-6 for a combined meeting of the Society for the Study of Amphibians and Reptiles and the Herpetologists' League. Host for the combined meeting of snake and lizard aficionados is the North Carolina Museum of Natural History.

More than 500 scientists from the United States and 25 foreign countries will meet at Meredith College to hear world-famous experts on subjects like the evolution of amphibians and reptiles as presented by Dr. David Wake of the University of California at Berkeley. Even Poland, still in the grips of a tight travel policy, will be sending one of their herpetologists to the Raleigh meeting. And the president of Yale University will be in attendance also.

But professionals are not the only parties invited. Amateur herpetologists and students are encouraged to attend the conference as well.

This meeting has drawn considerable national attention, even a letter of

encouragement from President Reagan and letters of endorsement from several governors. While in the state many of the scientists will make field trips.

Staff members from the N.C. Museum of Natural History, N.C. State University, and Appalachian State University and volunteers from the N.C. Herpetological Society and the N.C. Natural Society will provide manpower for the conference.
