From Tom Mann Just where in the heck do days when birds arring dog and dogs' tongues ar Well, ta home you seek out cool spots, out of the sun, and try to get comfortable
right? That's just what fish do
too. They find shady area where it's cooler, like back under lily pads, weeds, and
brush. Or, they bask under overhangs such as undercut banks, deadfalls, logs, and
piers. Also, they seek deeper, mid - lake water close to the thermoclin
where it's cooler where it's cooler.
To find the thermocline where fish hang out, tie a thermocline to about Lower it a couple of feet at time and take a reading drops about a degree for each foot of depth. But when
you hit the thermocine it you hit the thermocline
can drop from five to te can drop from five to ten
degrees. When you encounter this, then check the depth by your string length and fish just above the thermocline because that's
where the fish may be. If no where the fish may be. If not
there then fish around those shady spots mentioned, using jellyworms on the
uottom, and surface lures on bottom, and surface lures on
