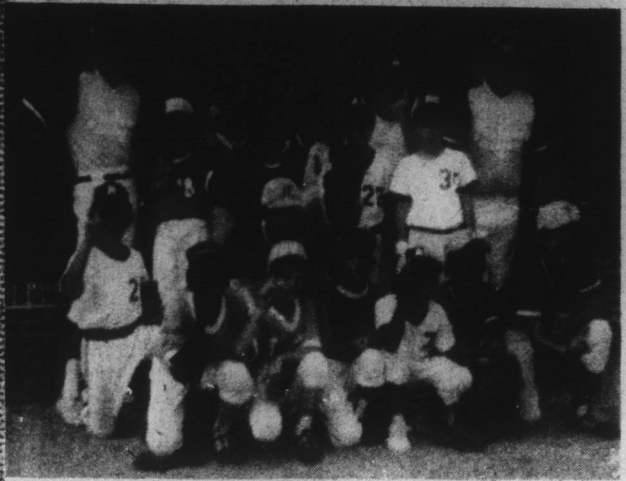


Revival To Be Held

Chris Loftis - Walking For Church World Service

No man is an island; No man stands alone Each man's joy is joy to me; Each man's grief is my own. We need one another So I will defend Each man as my brother, Each man as my friend.

With this song Chris Loftis ends each musical show he performs. This summer Chris will be closing benefit concerts all the way across North Carolina with this song of brotherhood. He will be walking from the Blue Ridge Mountains to the Outer Banks -- 700 miles in eight weeks -- to call attention to local and global hunger needs and how one involved person can make a difference.

Loftis is a seminary student at Southeastern Baptist Seminary in Wake Forest and a resident dorm advisor at the North Carolina School for Science and Mathematics in Durham. The Gastonia native writes many of his own songs and has performed them at local Triangle area restaurants, campuses, churches, and CROP Walks.

As an undergraduate student in biological science education at Duke University, he was co-coordinator of the Durham CROP Walk For the Hungry for two years. He sang with the late Harry Chapin on two occasions at local concerts in North Carolina. He shares Chapin's celebrated concern and involvement on behalf of the world's one billion hungry,

employing his talents in benefit concerts to help Church World Service provide relief to some of the eighteen million refugees in Africa, Asia, and Latin America.

"I am making this walk not as a statement against all the wrongs of society which produce hunger for one-quarter of the earth's people," Loftis explains. "My voice can only be a whisper in the ongoing global discussion of what to do about increasing hunger and malnutrition both in this country and abroad. But a whisper speaks louder than silence. Like thousands of annual CROP walkers in N.C., I plan to let my feet do my talking about my concern for local and global hungry persons."

One of Loftis' objectives for this summer's cross-state walk is to meet grass roots people all over North Carolina and to listen to their stories as well as to share his songs with them. Another is to raise funds for and consciousness about hunger.

"Poor people are not just

statistics; they have faces," Loftis states. "They are somebody's grandmother and somebody's child. Many are hard-working, single-parent women without even a high school education and can't work outside the home. I believe that we must help them help themselves and their children. Many of them are eating pet food now and things are getting worse."

The Carolinas CROP office in Durham has arranged to make a documentary of Loftis' encounters this summer with North Carolina's poor. "We're going to use it as a statewide educational medium and a sensitizing device," said Ed King, director of Carolinas CROP—Church World Service. "We're encouraging all Carolinians to walk a mile or two with Chris as he passes through their county or to support Chris' efforts with tax-exempt contributions to CROP—Church World Service, 1006 Lamand, Durham 27701. 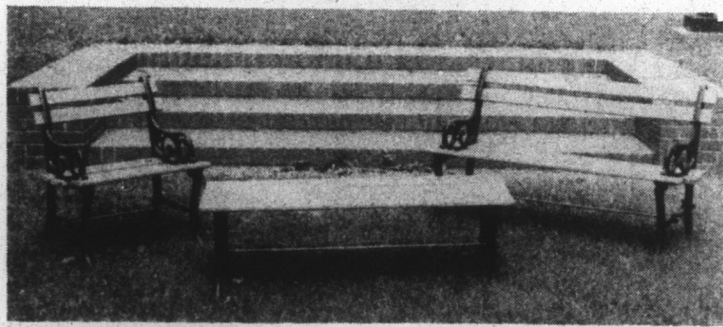
Service, the sponsoring agency, is a thirty-five year old relief and self-help development organization of 34 Protestant denominations in the U.S. with projects in over fifty of the world's most poverty-stricken regions. It delivers emergency relief to refugee camps and to victims of natural and man-made disasters, as well as administering food-for-work, water development, sanitation, literacy, and nutrition development

projects in many rural areas of the world where annual per capita income averages no more than \$60-80.
