## "KGB: The Lie...And The Truth"

"KGB: The Lie...And The Truth", a special two - and - one - half - hour public service presentation, intended to reveal the shocking extent of Soviet Communist espionage, aimed at the downfall of the United States, will air exclusively on WTBS, August 28, 8:05 - 10:35 P.M.

Touted by its producers, "The Coalition for Freedom," as an accurate account of the Soviet secret intelligence organization's infiltration throughout the world, "KGB...The Lie...And The Truth" is a composite of research into KGB activities.

Hosted by Rep. Philip Crane of Illinois, the documentary revolves around interviews with

people who claim to have participated in, and - or to have first - hand knowledge of KGB plots to steal secret information, create civil riots and perpetrate all manners of situations undermining the United States, throughout the nation and the world. The interviews are excerpted from recent television documentaries which have received limited exposure in the U.S., including "The KGB Connection," a highly acclaimed Canadian film which, although given unlimited press and aired widely in Canada, Great Britain and Sweden, has been viewed only privately in the U.S.A. Also excerpted are "The War Called Peace," a property of

Amajin, Inc. of Erie, Pa., which has been seen only on the Public Broadcasting System; and "Radical Operations." Speaking from Washington, to update the excerpted segments of the program with the latest developments in investigations of KGB activities, will be several public figures, including Sens. Jesse Helms and John East of North Carolina. "The Coalition for Freedom," headed by Sens. Helms and East, says of its special production, "KGB: The Lie...And The Truth," "This program is a must for every American interested in learning the truth about the Communists' threat to freedom."
