


## Booster Club Supper



## Weyerhaeuser Bulletin—Reports On Progress

Fiber Mill Manager, Paul Schmitt said this week that due to the extremely poor economy, it is probable that NC-1 machine which makes linerboard used in the manufacture of corrugated boxes or shipping containers will shut down the last week in September and the first week in October.

"Unfortunately, this shutdown will require laying off some personnel in all areas back to and including the wood yard during the shutdown period", Schmitt said.

Schmitt also said, the unsettled business climate makes it impossible to be definite about the length of the shutdown.

The Plymouth Merchandiser has recently set several productivity records. Employees processed 22,698 tree-length logs at an average of 6.27 logs per minute, a new weekly record. This production was accomplished with only 6 per cent downtime, also a new weekly record.

In addition, a new record for a single shift was established on Thursday, August 19, 1982, when B shift processed 466 cunits (a cunit is 100 cubic feet of wood) from 3,071 tree-length logs at a rate of 6.4 logs per minute with no downtime. "All production and maintenance employees are to be congratulated for the excellent teamwork which makes productivity such as this possible", said Jim Wellborn, Scaler - Merchandiser Team Leader.

from separate questionnaires for women and men, will remain confidential, with all information being computerized for research purposes only.

Area residents, elected by the volunteer researchers, to participate in the survey will represent a cross section of Chowan County's over 30 years old populace. Volunteer researchers Daisy Bemby, Helen Hollowell, Marguerite Jones, Louise Pratt, Ella Foxwell, Elsie Hare, Elva Stroud, Eula Jordan, Fran Ward and Mary Julia Parrish are among the Extension Homemakers members who will be working closely with the survey.

The American Cancer Society will conduct a six year follow-up program on all "subject" families completing this fall's survey. The first follow-up will come in 1984, with additional follow-ups in 1986 and 1988.

Coordinator Parrish feels confident that those approached to participate will do so unhesitatingly. "By working together as concerned citizens and homemakers", she said, "I feel that the survey will be a success in Chowan County." She urges all to "remember that today is what counts"

and to "use it to help research to possibly stamp out cancer in our lifetime".

Data from the first Cancer Prevention Study was gathered over a 13-year period, from 1959 - 72, and helped researchers identify many factors related to cancer development. Since the first CPS, many changes have taken place in the way people live, in what they eat, products they use and in home and workplace environments. A large study like CPS II is the most effective way to find out which environmental factors increase cancer risk and need most control and which carry little or no risk. It is intended that the knowledge gained from the survey will enable cancer researchers to work toward the goal of preventing cancer and saving thousands of lives.


