

New Book About The State - "Facts About North Carolina Agriculture"

The Tar Heel state is described as "a place to live and grow" in a newly revised booklet, "Facts About North Carolina Agriculture," published by the N.C. Agricultural Extension Service.

"The wide variation in natural characteristics of the state makes it possible to produce many types of farm commodities in North Carolina," states the 70-page publication.

"Furthermore, the combination of these natural attributes with existing production technology, non-land resources, and available marketing facilities enables many of these commodities to be produced commercially."

The booklet was prepared by N.C. State University's extension economics and business staff, headed by Dr. R.C. Wells as specialist-in-charge. Research assistant Dennis G. Allen revised and updated the text and tables.

"Modern agriculture can be viewed as a multi-linked chain of activities in the conversion of raw resources into consumable food and fiber products."

Firms in the industry can be grouped by function into three sectors - farm suppliers, farm producers, and farm product marketing firms, the booklet says.

Advances in technology have resulted in the consolidation of many small farms and a reduction in the number of farms. In 1950 North Carolina had more than 300,000 farms, but the number now is just below 90,000.

Land in farms has dropped from 19.9 million acres three decades ago to

11.1 million acres at present. Average farm size has nearly doubled, rising from 66 acres to 123 acres.

In 1978 about 54 per cent of the farm operators in the state were full owners, 31 per cent were part owners and 15 per cent were tenants.

Cash receipts from marketing of farm commodities in North Carolina rose above \$3 billion in 1978 and have been well above that level ever since. Receipts in 1980 exceeded \$3.6 billion.

The NCSU booklet contains suggestions on selecting a farm in the Tar Heel state.

"The first question to be answered is whether the

operation is to be strictly commercial, part-time farming or the rural resident-type with emphasis on supplementing the family income. A second consideration is the system of farming to be followed.

"The answers to these questions will influence the choice of location, size and type of farm to be purchased."
