

Hertford Getting Ready For Indian Summer Festival

 Fall is just around the corner and with it will come the first annual Indian Summer Festival in Hertford, sponsored by the Perquimans County Chamber of Commerce.

To be kicked off on Thursday with Farm-City Day, the festival promises fun for everyone right through to the grand finale - a street dance at Missing Mill Park, featuring Nita Bowen and the Dixie Clippers Saturday at 8 P.M.

Farm-City Thursday will include a variety of farm-

related displays under a circus tent in Missing Mill Park. B and S Enterprises, Hertford Motor Company and Byrum Implement Company are a few of the companies sponsoring farm equipment displays.

Guests Jim Walter, president of the N.C. Soybean Association, and representatives of the N.C. Peanut Growers Association will be on hand with demonstrations.

Hot dogs, hamburgers and other refreshments will go on sale at 10 A.M. and entertainment is planned throughout the day. E.L.

Hurdle will provide his famous french fried sweet potatoes. Billie Whitehurst of Museum of the Albemarle is scheduled to present a lecture on the Algonquin Indians at 3 P.M. at the Perquimans Senior Center.

Friday will find Hertford's sidewalks filled with old-fashioned bargains and historic window displays as the merchants participate in Colonial Day.

Character portrayals of historic Perquimans people will be presented on the Courthouse Green beginning at 11 A.M. and a walking tour of historic places will begin at 1 P.M. at the Perquimans Courthouse. To further promote the colonial theme Friday, the Hertford Fire and Drum Corps will present a historical flag display at 4 P.M.

Seafood lovers can try out the Fish Fry at the American Legion in Hertford beginning at 4 P.M. Plates will cost \$3 each and can be taken out or enjoyed at Missing Mill Park.

Festivities will continue at Memorial Field in Hertford where Perquimans Pirates fans will gather to cheer their victory of the Hurricanes of Northampton-West. Halftime activities will include the celebrated Marching Pirates in uniform for their second season, directed by David Zienba. Gametime is 8 P.M.

A 5K Race and Fun Run will begin Saturday's Fun Day. The run which will begin at Hertford Grammar School, is open to all ages. Trophies will be awarded to the overall winner and to winners in several age groups. Registration will begin at 8:30 A.M.

Co-sponsored by the Perquimans County Parks and Recreation Department and the Chamber of Com-

merce, the entry fee is \$7. The fun run is \$1.

While joggers race over the 3.1-mile trek, booths will be opening downtown, selling wares from arts to crafts to chocolate cakes to popcorn.

Participating will be craftsmen offering wood craft, crochet, dolls, puppets, ducks, windchimes, pillows, baskets, Christmas ornaments, quilt racks, shells, plastic needlepoint, counted cross stitch, fabric craft, and much more.

Plenty of food will be on hand, along with commercial displays downtown.

A dunking booth, train rides, fishing, apple bobbing, face painting, scavenger hunting and other activities have been scheduled for children in the park playground in Hertford.

A full line-up of entertainment has been scheduled for the downtown area and Missing Mill Park through Saturday. Included in the schedule will be the

Albemarle Pops Orchestra, the Flatland Cloggers, the Navy 4-Star Combo, Brenda Parker, the Lavezzo Sisters, the Cann Puppeteers and the Spirited Truth Gospel Singers along with others.

The festival will wind up at 8 P.M. Saturday with a street dance at Missing Mill Park featuring Nita Bowen and the Dixie Clippers.

Helium balloons, festival T-shirts, and other novelties will be on sale throughout town during the three-day fest. Maps, schedules and other information will be available at several Information Booths located throughout the town. For additional information, call the Chamber of Commerce at 426-5657.

Constitution Week Proclaimed

The following proclamation was signed by Mayor Roy Harrell on September 10, setting aside the week of September 17 through 23 as Constitution week in the City of Edenton.

WHEREAS, September 17, 1982, marks the one hundred ninety - fifth anniversary of the drafting of the Constitution of the United States of America by the Constitutional convention; and

WHEREAS, To accord official recognition to this memorable anniversary, and to the patriotic exercise that will form a noteworthy feature of the occasion, seems fitting and proper; and

WHEREAS, Public Law No. 915 guarantees the issuing of a proclamation each year by the President of the United States of America designating September 17 through September 23 as Constitution Week.

Now, Therefore, I Roy L. Harrell by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Edenton, in the state of North Carolina do hereby proclaim the week of September 17 through 23 as

Constitution Week, in the City of Edenton, and urge all our citizens to pay special attention during that week to our Federal Constitution and the advantages of American Citizenship.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the City to be affixed at 12:27 P.M. this the tenth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty - two and the Independence of the United States of America, the two hundred and sixth.

Social Security: Speedier Processing

New procedures put into operation this year allow most Social Security numbers to be issued about 2 weeks after a person has applied and provided the required evidence and information.

Even with these new procedures, however, a person must provide evidence of his age, citizenship, and identity before a number can be issued.

Only original documents or copies certified by the agency which issued them can be used.

A person 18 or older, applying for a Social Security number for the first time, must apply in person.

The best evidence of age and citizenship is a public or hospital record of birth or a religious record of birth or baptism.

Identity can be established from records like a driver's license, school record, or medical record.

People who are not U.S. citizens should provide the appropriate immigration and Naturalization Service form as well as their foreign birth certificate.

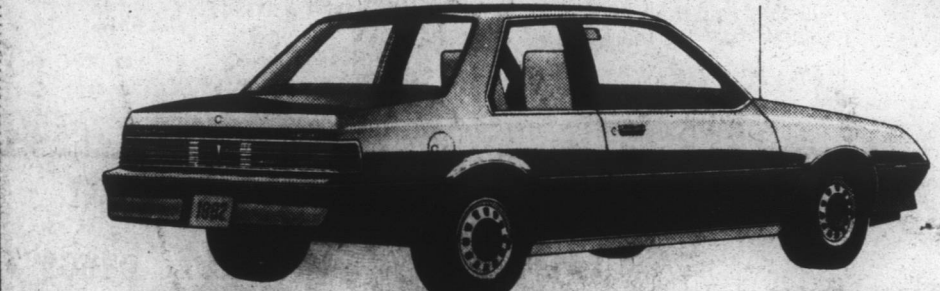
