Crowded Teeth

If your child's per-
manent teeth are
crowded because of an
extra tooth or a tooth
growing where it
shouldn't, your dentist
will know the best time to
extract it.

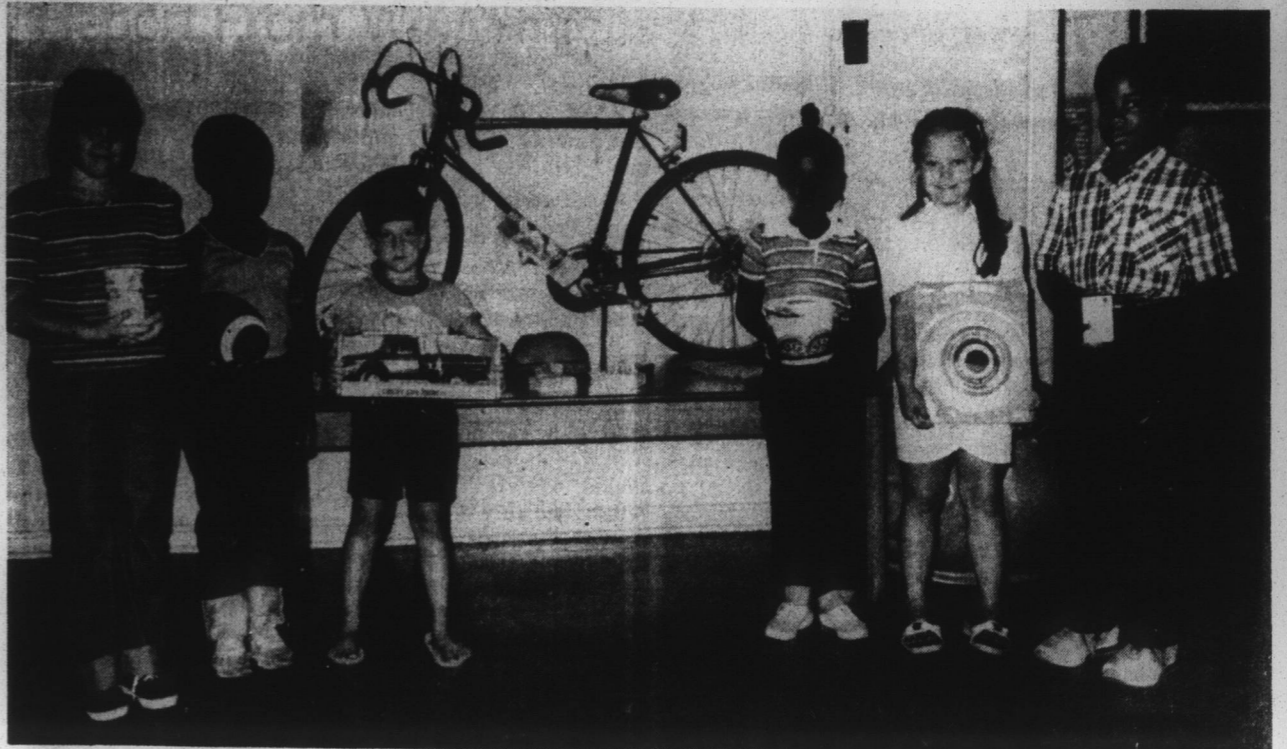
If it's a baby tooth, he
may want to extract the
extra tooth right away so
the permanent teeth will
have the room they need
when they erupt. But if
it's a case of crowding of
permanent teeth, he may
want to wait until the
child is older and all the
permanent teeth are in
place. It's a question of
timing, of knowing the
ideal time to relieve the
crowding problem.

Crowded teeth can
alter the shape of the
mouth and interfere with
the natural functions of

chewing and speaking.
They also affect ap-
pearance. Obviously,
you're concerned about
your child's appearance
and health. If it's a dental
problem, it should be
taken care of BEFORE it
becomes more difficult to
treat.
That's what makes
regular dental checkups
important. If there's any
problem, including
crowded teeth, it can be
treated before it gets out

Changing Glasses

If you have regular eye
checkups and have your
glasses changed when
needed, the transition to new
glasses is usually com-
fortable enough. But if you've
put off having your eyes
checked and there've been
some major changes in your

changes gradually, so
