grin and bear it. The North Carolina Medical Society says there is usually nothing to worry about. Sleeplessness and irregular or interrupted sleeping patterns are normal for healthy infants. About 70 per cent of infants will begin to sleep through the night by three months, and 80 per cent by six months.

If a child is not sleeping through the night by one year—and 10 per cent don't—it may be that parents are encouraging irregular sleeping habits by not

responding consistently to an infant's demands. Professional advice and attention may help. Fortunately for most, however, it's sweet dreams long before the end of baby's first year.
