market value. Dennis Burgess, COA occupational education director, estimates that the market value of the structure in its current state of completion is somewhere in the neighborhood of \$26,000 to \$28,000. "Present material and labor costs would indicate a selling price in that range," he

said. College officials do not anticipate making a profit from the sale, Dr. Gerald W. Bray, dean of administrative services, said. "We do want to regain the cost of the materials we have invested in the building, however," he said. Bray explained that the proceeds from the sale will be used to perpetuate the training project. ministration (SSA) has announced plans for upgrading its computer operations.

The agency's computer capability impacts on almost everyone in the Albemarle area.

SSA's automatic date processing operation maintains records on 240 million workers, 36 million Social Security beneficiaries, and 4.1 million Supplemental Security Income recipients. Each year it processes

about 380 million wage reports from employers and 19 million transactions for persons already on the

Social Security rolls. The computer network handles 7.5 million new applications for benefits and 10 million requests for Social Security cards each year.
