### Precision Removable Dentures

If you need a partial denture to fill a gap caused by lost teeth, you may want to consider the precision removable denture.

In this technique, the supporting teeth on both sides are crowned. The partial denture hooks INTO the crowned teeth rather than around them. Located on the back of each supporting crown is a "female" attachment. That's what the "male" attachment on the partial denture hooks into. No wire clasps are needed to hold the denture in place. There'll be nothing for anyone to see when you open your mouth except the teeth that now fill the gap that used to make you feel self-conscious.

That's an advantage for you. There's also an advantage for your dentist. By crowning the supporting teeth he can shape them for the best possible fit for your partial denture. That's an advantage for you, too. A good fit not only gives the denture stability, it gives you comfort and good appearance. It is also the most secure type of partial to use for a long span of missing teeth.

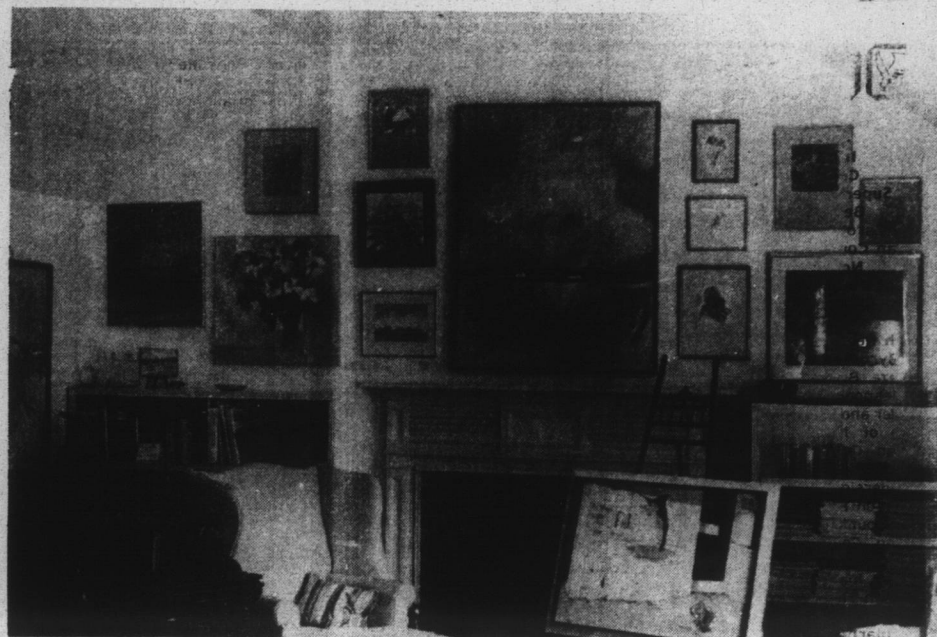

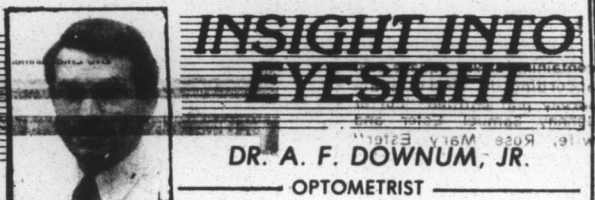

### When You Need Bifocals

People who have two kinds of vision problems can benefit from bifocals. They're a lot less trouble than having two pair of glasses.

In a bifocal lens, the top part is used for viewing objects nearby or at a distance, depending on the correction needed. If you're nearsighted, this brings nearby objects into focus. If you're farsighted, it sharpens images seen far away. And if you have an astigmatism or double-focus problem, it will bring things into focus no matter how close or far away.

The bottom part of a bifocal lens is for reading. This part of the lens compensates for an inability to use the near-focusing muscles of the eye. This happens to most people as they approach

middle age and beyond. Until you try them yourself, you may think bifocals are difficult to use, but most people soon get used to them quickly and find them more practical than having two pair of glasses.

We usually look down when we read and look up to see objects at a distance. Bifocals are designed with this in mind.

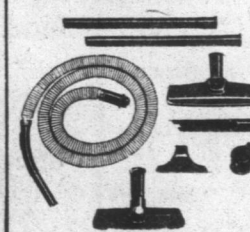
